New CAS Appointed Curtis Replaces Leckie

RCAF headquarters has announced the retirement of Air Marshal Robert S. Leckie. Chief of Air Staff. Following a short period of leave, the air marshal is expected to take up an important liaison post with the Air Cadet League of Canada.

The new CAS is Air Marshal W. A. Curtis, formerly Air Member for Air Plans. His position has been filled by A/V/M A. L. Morfee, former AOC, Eastern Air Command, who was posted to Ottawa early this year when the RCAF's five commands were reduced to two.

Aged 54, A/M Curtis started his service career in the Niverville, C.B., of Outre-Army in 1915, transferring mont.

later to the Royal Naval Air Service where he reached the rank of flight commander before 1918. He was awarded the D.S.C. and Bar during that war. For some years he served in the Toronto Scottish Regiment before becoming the commanding officer of 110 Auxuliary Squadron in Toronto.

As a W/C, he was called up for regular service in September 1939, becoming successively Director of Postings and Records, AF HQ, Ottawa; Commanding Officer No. 2 Flying Training Service School; Director of Air Force Manning and then Deputy C in C, RCAF Overseas.

On his return to Canada he became Air Member for Air Staff and later Air Member or Air Plans. His decorations include C.B., C.B.E., D.S.C. and Efficiency Decoration.

He was one of the founders of the Toronto Flying Club and was its president for three vears.
