I thank you for your letter of Jan'y 20/70 regarding the agreement of Jan'y 27th. 1964. I am very pleased that my change of domicile from Canada to the Bahamas is acceptable to the company. I assure you that I will continue to make myself available for advisory and consulting services.

Regarding deductions from my remuneration of \$105⁰⁰ per month for ten months for the purchase of a \$1,000⁰⁰ Canada Savings Bond, I would ask you to discontinue this deduction.
