

Sale to military service associations
or municipal authorities of CF100 or
F86 aircraft now being sold for scrap

26. The Minister of Defence Production said that his department received requests from time to time from municipalities and military service associations in the neighborhood of air force bases for obsolete CF100 and F86 aircraft as souvenirs. These aircraft were being sold for scrap at about \$200 each.

27. During the discussion it was said that it would not be wise to sell these aircraft for this purpose if they were to be allowed to disintegrate or to be used as places to play by children, or otherwise to become unsightly.

28. The Cabinet agreed with the recommendation of the Minister of Defence Production that CF100 or F86 aircraft which were now surplus and for which the only other market was as scrap be sold on request to military service associations or municipal authorities as souvenirs or memorials at the going scrap values, provided a satisfactory undertaking is given by the purchaser that the aircraft will be maintained in proper condition.

Appointment; Assistant Grain Commissioner

29. The Minister of Agriculture recommended the appointment of Mr. Graham Williams as Assistant Grain Commissioner for Saskatchewan, replacing Mr. Clifford Hunt.

30. During the discussion it was said that the distribution of Assistant Grain Commissioners between the three prairie provinces was uneven. Number and distribution was fixed by statute, two for Saskatchewan, one for Alberta and one for Manitoba. The provincial distribution of Commissioners was not fixed by statute. The present distribution was one for Manitoba and two for Saskatchewan.

31. The Cabinet deferred a decision on the appointment of an Assistant Grain Commissioner for Saskatchewan.

National Energy Board; export of small
units of power

32. The Cabinet agreed with the recommendation of the Minister of Veterans Affairs that the National Energy Board be given the right, without public hearing, to export small units of power not to exceed 1000 kilowatt hours.
