-'54-55 Designed conversion of 'CF100 MK3' models (80plus aircraft) into 'CF 100 MK3CT' Trainer Planes.



He left AVRO before I was born but he always spoke fondly of his time there.

After AVRO he went to:

- Northwest Industries in Edmonton. I think they modified/maintained aircraft for use in the north.
- Boeing. He did something on the 727/737 programs. They were new back then.
- General Dynamics in San Diego. I think it was the Atlas/Centaur missile programs.
- Atlantic Reserch in the LA area. They made small missiles.
- Rohr Industries in San Diego (and their successor Goodrich Aerospace). He led the preliminary design function there for many years until his retirement in about 1993.

I am his only surviving son (my name is Don. His wife (my mom), Shirley, pre-deceased him by many years. He has 2 grandchildren. One is a nurse, the other an engineer. Both in California.

In the photo you sent of his graduating class, I noticed his friend Bill Burge from Calgary. I got the impression Bill also worked at AVRO, but I'm not entirely sure. He was friends with Bill for many years.

I digitized many photos/documents from the family, but didn't find anything from the AVRO years. There are a couple of boxes kicking around and I am supposed to sort through them later this year. .If I see something, I will let you know.
