Engineers Needed

A. V. Ree Canada Ltd. has agreed to sponsor a national conference on scientific and engineering manpower aimed at analyzing and assessing the supply and demand of professional engineers and technical personnel, it has been announced by Crawford Gordon, Jr., president of A. V. Roe Canada. The conference is scheduled for September and will be held in Toronto.

Mr. Gordon told a meeting of the Canadian Manufacturers Association that the present shortages in the fields of teaching, engineering, medicine, and research, have reached the acute stage, and the western world is training less than half the number of scientists and engineers required for industrial and defence purposes.

A general advisory committee has

been set up, and it is expected that some leading figures in the fields of education, government, the professional societies, labor and industry will participate in the two-day conference.

Nine Constellations

TCA is now operating a total of nine Super Constellations according to a recent announcement heralding the addition of two more of the aircraft in June. The new airplanes will be used on both trans-continental and trans-oceanic routes.

Cup Race

The Governor-General's Cup Race is to be a feature of the Canadian International Air Show this year on September 8. The gold cup and \$500 in cash will go to the winner of the race, which is open to all pilots holding private or commercial licenses who are not employed in a pilot capacity. Second and third place winners will receive \$200 and \$100 respectively.

Scintillation Surveys

Section 820 of the Air Regulations has been amended so that it applies to aerial photographic surveys only, it has been announced by the DoT.

The section in question reads in part: "No person shall make a recording from an aircraft, by any method, of features and properties of the earth over any part of Canada or the territorial waters of Canada without the permission of the Minister (of Transport), except where the area to be surveyed is owned or leased by the operator of the aircraft, and the operator is a Canadian citizen or a (Canadian) company or corporation . . ."
