PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS FOR ARROW WEAPON SYSTEM
PROGRAMS AT COLD LAKE

1. Summary

- 1.1 This report details estimated Associate Contractors' personnel requirements to support Arrow Weapon System programs at RCAF Cold Lake during 1960 and 1961. These programs are:
 - (a) Contractors' Sparrow 2 development.
 - (b) Contractors' demonstration of the Arrow Weapon System.
 - (c) RCAF evaluation Phases 4, 5 and 7.
- 1.2 These requirements are based on certain assumptions, stated in the body of this report, as to the responsibilities of the RCAF and the Associate Contractors, the numbers and degree of participation of trained RCAF personnel, and the living accommodation available for contractors' personnel. Changes in these terms of reference may very significantly affect the personnel requirements.
- 1.3 This report assumes greater RCAF participation than that stated in Avro Preliminary Report No. 72/GEQ/4-1 issued in April 1958; consequently the contractors' personnel requirements are not as great.
- 1.4 Avro Aircraft Limited participation in these programs is not covered in all cases in the existing Arrow Program Statement of Work (Brochure AD-51); items requiring additional coverage are noted in this report.
- 1.5 It is concluded that provision of the stated requirements will ensure adequate support to the relevant programs provided the schedule is rigidly maintained. Any prolongation or unanticipated overlap of these programs will raise an additional requirement for contractor personnel which will be extremely difficult to satisfy because of the limited family accommodation presently planned for Cold Lake.
- 1.6 The provision of 40 family dwelling units as presently planned by the Government is wholly inadequate. At least 130 units will be required to house contractors' personnel who cannot be replaced by RCAF personnel during the program. It is recommended that the decision to provide only 40 units be reconsidered.

2. Assumptions

The following assumptions have been made in estimating the number of people required.

- 2.1 Canadair Limited will have prime responsibility for the Sparrow 2 program, receiving airframe, engine and electronic system support from the other Associate Contractors concerned.

2.1 Cont'd

The AWS Co-ordinating Contractor and the Associate Contractors will be responsible for the Arrow Weapon System demonstration program. Assistance with both programs will be given by a number of RCAF tradesmen who will be attached to CEPE for administrative purposes, and who will be gradually integrated to replace contractor maintenance personnel.

- 2.2 The maintenance and operation of aircraft involved in Phases 4, 5 and 7 of the RCAF evaluation program will be the responsibility of the RCAF, supported by a minimum number of contractor personnel. Contractor-supplied tradesmen and their supervision will be withdrawn from Cold Lake at the end of December 1960, leaving only engineering and technical representative support.

This assumes greater RCAF participation than that stated in Avro Preliminary Report No. 72/GEQ/4-1 "Base Facilities at RCAF Cold Lake Arrow 2 Development and Demonstration Program" issued April 1958. It is considered realistic in view of the Avro-managed RCAF training program now under consideration.

- 2.3 Avro Aircraft Limited will be awarded a contract for the training of RCAF personnel in the Arrow Weapon System in sufficient time to provide an adequate number of trained men commencing in early 1960.

- 2.4 130 family dwelling units will be available for housing contractors' personnel and their families. The Government has advised Avro that only 40 units will be provided but, since this is wholly inadequate, it is recommended that this decision be reconsidered. Provision of additional RCAF maintenance personnel will not resolve this problem, since the family units are allocated to service representatives, engineers, etc. who must remain at Cold Lake over six months, and cannot be directly replaced by RCAF people.

The limited accommodation available will necessarily restrict contractor operation to one shift and overtime.

Bachelor officers' quarters and sergeants' quarters will be available in the numbers noted in paragraph 5.

Those people assigned to family dwelling units, and single men in bachelor quarters, will be expected to remain in Cold Lake until the completion of the programs. Married men occupying bachelor quarters will remain a maximum of six months, and where possible will be replaced by RCAF personnel. A survey has shown that about 10% of contractors' employees are unmarried, and thus presumably could remain for the duration of the programs. In preparing these estimates it has been assumed that this will be offset by some married men being unable to remain the full six months on account of illness or family reasons.

- 2.5 Throughout all the programs discussed in this report, the RCAF will provide the following personnel and facilities:

2.5 Cont'd

- (a) Refuelling services, consumable stores, utility transportation and unskilled labour as required.
- (b) Secretarial assistance as required.
- (c) Labour to transport missiles from the magazine to the missile preparation area.
- (d) A ground telemetering facility.
- (e) A GCI and a ground station data link, and operation of these facilities.
- (f) Data reduction and processing facilities at least comparable to those already in existence at Cold Lake.
- (g) Airframe, electronics, missile and engine ground support equipment.

3. Programs

The programs at Cold Lake and their phasing are described in Figure 1.

4. Number of Personnel

- 4.1 The estimated total number of people required to support the programs, and the relative participation of fully trained contractor and RCAF personnel, are summarized in Figure 2. While it is assumed that a number of RCAF tradesmen will be posted to Cold Lake early in 1960, their Arrow Weapon System training will have consisted largely of lectures. They will require some additional on-the-job training before they can be considered ready for full participation in the program.
- 4.2 Associate Contractors' personnel requirements for operation of their programs are summarized in Figure 3.
- 4.3 RCAF participation in the contractors' programs is summarized in Figure 4. This is a minimum requirement for fully trained personnel to maintain program schedules; other RCAF people available may receive contact training and assist in critical stages of the program.
- 4.4 Associate Contractors' support to RCAF evaluation programs is summarized in Figure 5. This is based on 100% support (on a one shift basis) initially, dropping to 50% maintenance support in September 1960. Maintenance personnel are withdrawn December 31, 1960. Engineering and technical representative support are maintained fully throughout the programs.

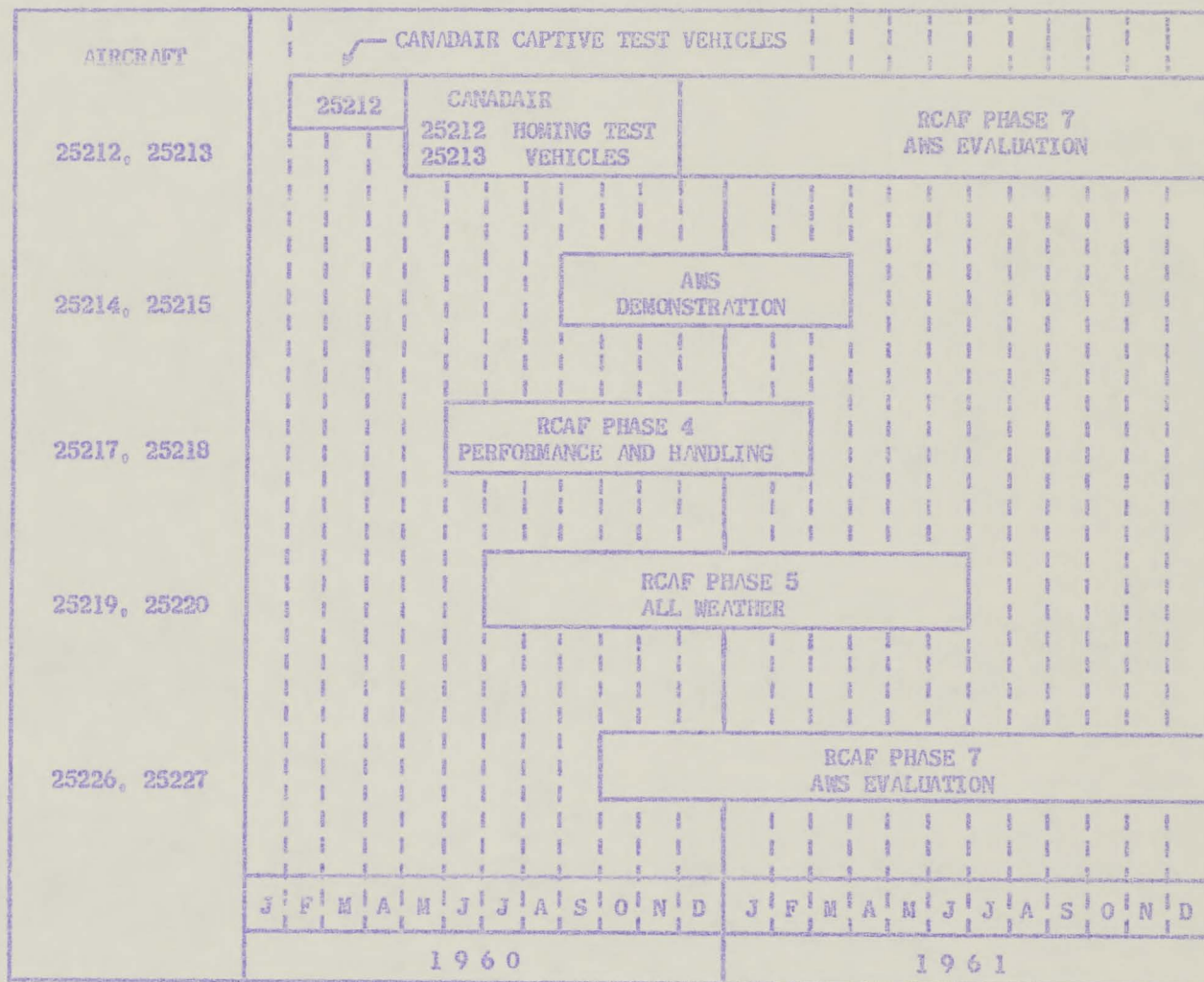
5. Living Accommodation

5.1 Allocation of a total of 130 family dwelling units and requirements for bachelor officers' and sergeants' quarters are shown in Figures 6, 7 and 8 respectively.

5.2 In addition to the bachelor quarters specified in Figures 7 and 8, provision should be made for housing about 12 transient contractor employees who may be sent to Cold Lake from time to time to deal with specific problems.

6. Contractual Coverage

Maintenance at Cold Lake for the Sparrow 2 program (aircraft 25212 and 25213), and the demonstration program (aircraft 25214 and 25215) are covered by paragraphs 8.3.7 and 8.5.4(c) respectively in Avro's Statement of Work for the Arrow Program. However, no coverage was included for support to the RCAP Phases 4, 5 and 7 evaluation program because it could not be defined adequately at the time the document was issued.
