D. L. "Buck" Buchanan, secretary-manager of the RCFCA for the past several years, has been appointed Ottawa representative for The de Havilland Aircraft of Canada Limited. He has been succeeded as secretary-manager of the RCFCA by George Hurren, manager of the Toronto Flying Club at the time of his new appointment.

Buck Buchanan began his aviation career when he took a flying instructor's course with Ernie Taylor at Hamilton, Ontario, in 1939. 
