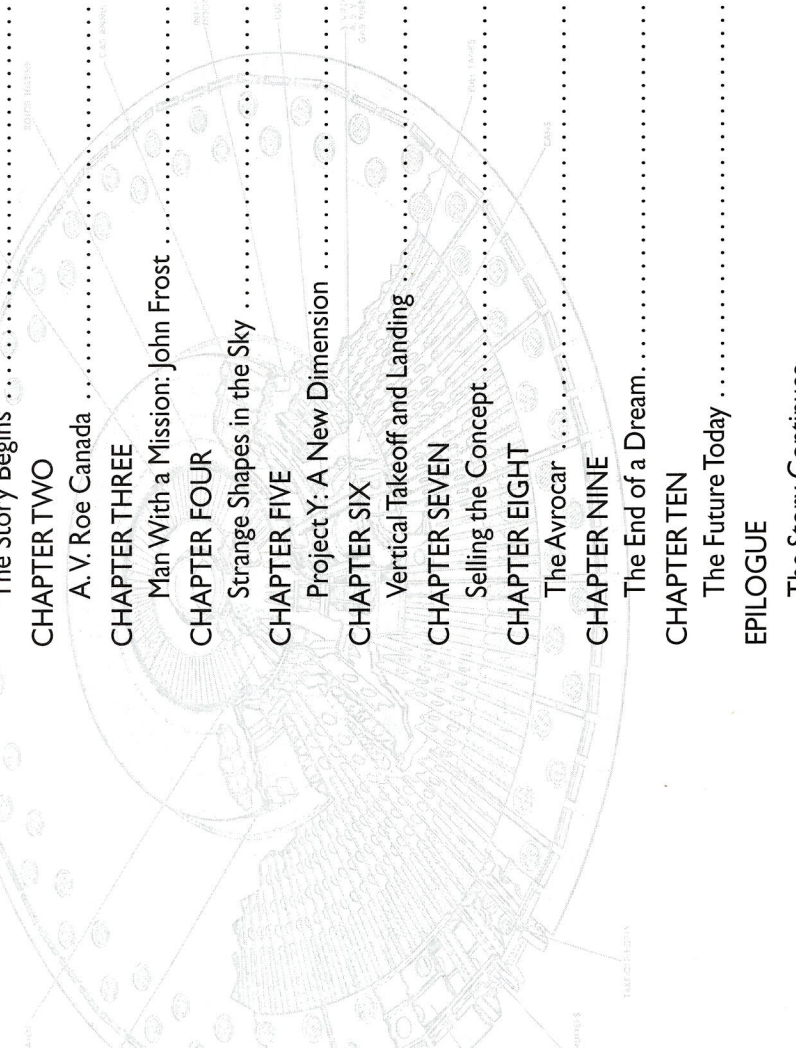

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ASK THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ABOUT FLYING SAUCERS and you will be handed a fact sheet stating that, since the closure of Project Blue Book in 1974, the USAF has no interest in, and does not study, the subject. But in the 1950s, the U.S. government was interested and was in fact *building* flying saucers with the help of the highly talented aviation design team known as Avro Canada's Special Projects Group.

Travel back in time to the paranoid days of the Cold War, when fear of invasion by Communists and aliens from other planets seemed almost equally plausible. This remarkable book — the result of 30 years of research — shows

North American-made flying saucers in various stages of production and in actual test flights. Astonishing U.S. military illustrations from the period reveal the saucers' intended use in combat.

A leading authority on Canadian aviation, author Bill Zuk is Canada's resident Avrocar "saucer" expert and leads the battle to "Bring Canada's Flying Saucer Home." (Two survive in U.S. museums.)

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
