INSIDE TV

ARRON the heart

The proud jet's sudden death in 1959 caused a fire storm of controversy. Now its story comes to an eviscerated CBC, raising more questions about government cutbacks and a battered national identity

the Avro Arrow was designed by Canadian brains, built by Canadian hands and killed by Canadian politicians. Some say that it was a dud and that it made good old common sense for Diefenbaker to kill it. Others say that it was an aeronautical wonder and that American pressure and Tory spite killed it. But whichever way you see it, the great Canadian dream to build the fastest jet in the world died nearly 40 years ago. And in all that time, the recriminations, the bitterness and the charges of political plots and conspiracies have never stopped. So after it took seven long years to get the Arrow story onto the TV screen, it seems only natural to ask, "Why so long? Was it another conspiracy . . ."

"Against having the Arrow story go ahead while the Conservatives were in power?" Keith Ross Leckie says, finishing the question himself. "There's probably something to that." And if anyone should know, Leckie should. It was Leckie who got the idea, wrote the script and then spent seven years trying to get it made first as a TV movie-of-theweek (1989-92), then as a feature film (1992-93) and, finally, in its present form, as a two-part mini-series. When the project was planned as a

feature film, he along with the two original producers (wife Mary Young Leckie and Paul Stephens) found plenty of interest in it — but strangely enough, not from the usual supporters of Can-culture.

"We had raised \$4.2 million from the Brits, and it was the Canadian funding that fell through," says Leckie. "Telefilm didn't believe that anyone would come to see it. Of course, you have to make your own conclusions about the influence of the government in power at the time."

Maybe after hacking apart Canada's great national railway, the



Mulroney government was none too keen to see a movie made about how the Conservatives killed the Arrow. And maybe Telefilm could only work up a lot of enthusiasm about The Arrow as a mini-series after the Liberals took power. But right from the time The Arrow was proposed as a feature film, Dan Aykroyd, who still calls himself a Canadian, was dedicated to the project. Leckie is the first to admit that it was Aykroyd's name that got The Arrow pre-sales in Britain, Australia, France, Germany and Japan and ensured financial support here at home. It's easy to say that it was ever thus - we Canadians only believe in the value of our stories if others think they are important. But the mini-series, coincidentally, airs at a time when CBC is under the Liberal axe.

"I've heard from more than one source that this will probably be the last mini-series on the CBC for a few years," says Leckie. "So *The Arrow* is a wonderful parable for

this country. The government is slashing the CBC in the same way

that the government slashed the Arrow program. And do the people support this slashing of our cultural industries? But it's bigger than that. Do we want to have a country? That's a question we ask in this mini-series."

If *The Arrow* is the last big mini-series for the CBC, it makes a mighty impressive splash. There is a full roster of stars — Aykroyd, Sara Botsford, Christopher Plummer, Aidan Devine and Michael Moriarty. The props are lavish, the special effects are spectacular and the story crackles with intrigue. But let's not forget that *Continued on page 49*

The Arrow comes with serious intentions to set the record straight. Even the well-informed among us have trouble separating what's true and what's false about the Arrow:

The Arrow never got off the tarmac. False. Five Arrows flew with American engines. As for the Arrow 206 with the made-in-Canada Iroquois engine, Leckie says, "It was only two weeks away from flying, but Diefenbaker was worried about them showing the true potential of the plane, so he cancelled the project early." In the mini-series, Leckie takes dramatic license with an uplifting Free Willy finale.

When the Arrow program was

cancelled, all the planes were destroyed. True. All of them were hacked to pieces. Only a nose cone survives at the National Aviation Museum in Ottawa. For the mini-series, the producers were lucky to find Allan Jackson, an Albertan who was building a full-scale model of the Arrow.

Canada could never have competed with the U.S., France or Britain in technology. False. According to Leckie, "We were really a huge technological power in 1959. After the Arrow was cancelled, its chief designer, Jim Chamberlain (played by Devine), went down to NASA with 33 Arrow engineers and designed the space capsule for John Glenn." At the end of

> the mini-series, a list of achievements by former Arrow scientists rolls. Watch and weep.

Elwy Yost would never have become Mr. Movie on TVOntario if the Arrow hadn't been cancelled. True. Elwy worked in the personnel department of A.V. Roe when 14,500 people lost their jobs. Try to find Elwy in the crowd scenes when the Arrow is unveiled - he's the one crying real tears.
