
# THE CF-105 AVRO ARROW











Out of the ashes of political intrigue of the Diefenbaker era has risen a reglica of the CF-105 Avro Arrow. Built by Allan Jackson of Edmonton, the was duplicated right down to the dignitaries stand, the musicians were there plus about 350 or so actors all dressed in period clothing. The replica, constructed over the past two years, was unveiled in Winnipeg on Ady 4, 1996. The ceremony, following the original rollout of #201 in 1957 Winnipeg venue was chosen for the filming of the soon to be released film on the Arrow starring Dan Acroid.



There is even some talk of using HIS SON around age 5 or so and, duplicate the same mood as it was done in October, 1957.

I arrived in Winnipeg last July 03/96 and was able to go directly to the secret hangar for a sneak preview of the now newly completed CF-105 Arrow replica. I was shocked in awe as to the size and struck by the beauty of the mock up. The Construction Crew (of anywhere of 10 to 12 people) under the direction of David Melrose from Halifax, had done a magnificent job in a short and tight time frame what I was not able to do due to the incredible amount of work that still remained on the project.

The rollout on July 04, complete with the Arrow being towed though a huge Avro Banner which concealed the Arrow from the viewers eyes duplicated exactly the original


