## Your Municipal Services



"Our elected officials provide the leadership to enable us to effectively administer all City programs thereby providing your municipal services. I consider the City very fortunate in having as its elected officials individuals with an inborn sense of idealism. They provide leadership with visions of the future and the needs of the citizens in this community. We attempt to identify change before the change occurs which is needed rather than focus on the status quo. I consider the leadership of our elected officials as dedicated, imaginative and creative. As effective leaders, we must strive for understanding how things should be rather than how they are and continue to make those changes that are necessary. The citizens of Gulfport and the State of Florida are fortunate to have the Sunshine law and open government. All citizens are encouraged to visit the divisions within our municipality for purposes of seeking information and expressing their opinions. I would like to describe some of your municipal services."

#### OFFICE OF CITY CLERK

Responsibilities of the Clerk's Office include supervising the City election; attending City Council meetings, Planning and Zoning Board meeting, Planning Zoning Board of Appeals meetings and other meetings of designated Boards; keeping record of the proceedings of Board meetings; registration of voters and registration for homestead exemption. The City Clerk is custodian of all official records.

#### FINANCE DEPARTMENT

The Finance Department provides two primary functions to the City: (1) customer service to utility customers and (2) administration of the City's financial operations. The customer service employees are available to handle customer inquiries, process City utility payments, payments for Florida Power and Paragon Cable TV. The other financial operations include collection of revenues, disbursements to vendors and financial reporting to the appropriate authorities. The City has received a Certificate of Conformance in Financial Reporting from the Government Finance Officer's Association of the United States and Canada for the presentation of the City's financial reports.

#### HUMAN RESOURCES

This department provides a service for all other departments within the City and is responsible for the proper maintenance of all City personnel records and assures compliance with local, state, and federal laws and regulations regarding personnel management also formulates and recommends legal and administrative policies, rules, regulations and procedures for the personnel program. It conducts classification studies, prepares job specifications, develops and implements employee benefit programs; administers the City's insurance programs covering property, casualty, automobile, liability, flood and fire. It is responsible for developing informational publications and press releases.

#### LIBRARY

Our Library circulates about 10,000 of our 50,000 books per month together with many tapes, records and large print volumes. Our director and staff of six serve our community and often are assisted by volunteers. Many books not purchased with City monies are given by residents and those wishing to memorialize friends and relatives. Fifty puppets are available for children to take home or play with in their own theatre in their section of space. Special holidays are observed with parties during the year, and story hour is a weekly event. School programs bring students with their teachers.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Fire Department consists of 30 volunteers including officers and is responsible for fire prevention and suppression. Duties also include inspecting commercial establishments, issuing Certificates of Occupancy to businesses and enforcing the Life Safety Code and related City ordinances. Weekly drills conducted with Department officers in charge and participation in drills led by the Pinellas Vocational Technical Institute maintain firefighting capabilities of the Department. Meetings are held Monday evenings at seven. The Department sponsors a Jr. Firefighter program along with an Explorer Scout program.

#### EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

The E.M.S. Department consists of one Director and six Paramedics. Each Paramedic is required to keep current certification in Advanced Life Support, Basic Trauma Life Support, Basic Life Support, Emergency Medical Technician and Cardiopulmonary Resucitation. Continuing education is also provided by the City and County to help the Paramedics improve their skills in the E.M.S. field. It is the goal of the E.M.S. Department to provide the best and fastest emergency medical service possible to the citizens of Gulfport.

#### PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The main goal of the Parks and Recreations Department is to provide programs and facilities for the leisure pursuits of the citizens of Gulfport. The Parks division is responsible for the development, maintenance and beautification of all public owned parkland as well as the grounds of all public buildings. Recreation activities cover a broad spectrum: Children's programs such as after school and summer recreation, room rentals, holiday events and sports events. This Department supervises the Marina and the Ship's Store that carries a variety of goods including tackle, bait and other boating needs. They are also responsible for the renting and billing for 256 boat slips, and the maintenance of the Marina area.

#### PLANNING AND SOCIAL SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The Social Service Departments primary objective is to provide a comprehensive network of services to the elderly of Gulfport who comprise more than 50 percent of the City's population. Other functions of the department are: Administration of the Senior Center, operation of the Gulfport Mini-Bus Service and administration for Gulfport's Community Development Block Grant and Comprehensive Planning programs.

#### BUILDING INSPECTIONS

This Department checks and approves applications for occupational licenses. They inspect construction, alteration and repair activities on residential, industrial and commercial building sites and condemn unsafe structures. They recommend code revisions, and make recommendations to the Planning and Zoning Board, Board of Adjustment and the City Council.

#### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARIMENT

The Public Works Department administers the activities of four divisions. The Sanitation Division disposes of approximately 150 tons of debris each week. The Utilities Division maintains the water and sewer distribution system, reads meters, installs water meters and repairs leaks. The Street Division maintains traffic control signs, lights and school crossings, asphalt repairs, clearing of debris and trees in right-of-way, street sweeping and storm drain maintenance. The Vehicle Maintenance Division, includes two employees who maintain emergency vehicles, service trucks, tractors and cars in use daily.

#### POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Gulfport Police Department consists of 23 sworn Police Officers, civilian and part time employees. Employees are assigned to different shifts to give the City 24 hour, seven day a week Police services. The Department handles many kinds of complaints, including accident investigations, traffic and criminal arrests and code enforcement. It conducts, with volunteer assistance, a City-wide Crime Watch program featuring monthly training sessions and wide distribution of informational literature. An officer is assigned to Boca Ciega High School as a School Resource officer to coordinate between the high school and law enforcement personnel.

## Gulfport Historical Society

The GULFPORT HISTORICAL SOCIETY was organized on June 8, 1981 when fourteen civic minded individuals met in the office of Catherine A. Hickman.

The purposes of the organization are:

To preserve Gulfport artifacts for our posterity;

To leave to future generations the legacy of their roots;

To interview long-time residents and compile a history of Gulfport;

To find and preserve historic buildings;

To share memories;

To instill knowledge and pride in the City of Gulfport by residents.

The primary objective, to publish a history of Gulfport, was achieved as promised in October 1985 in time to help celebrate our City's 75th anniversary. The book was the result of the work of many dedicated people who spent countless hours gathering and editing the material presented in "OUR STORY OF GULFPORT, FLORIDA".

The second objective was to find a home for the memorabilia so generously donated by our citizens. Our museum became a reality in 1983 when the City leased to us a building at 5301 28th Ave. So. The members set about repairing and painting this historic building that had once housed the First United Methodist Church. Agnes Conron and Jan Cook, our first two curators, with the help of other volunteers, assembled the many items displayed within the museum. We are pleased that groups of children with their teachers and some parents have visited the museum on field trips. Copies of "OUR STORY OF GULFPORT, FLORIDA," were presented to the teachers at Gulfport Elementary School and Most Holy Name of Jesus Elementary School to help them prepare for their trips to the museum.

Membership meetings, featuring guest speakers, are held every other month from October through May and are open to the general public.


