



A SHORT HISTORY OF THE THREE GULFPORT CASINO'S

The building we know today as the Casino is actually the third building, so named, to sit at this site. The first was built on an 800 foot long pier, as a shelter for people waiting to transfer from the trolley onto boats bound for the outer islands, Tampa and all points beyond. A two story pavilion was opened in April 1906, and became known as the Casino, after the Italian designation for a community gathering place. Not then, certainly, and not ever, did it have any function as a place to gamble as the name implies today. It was at a meeting in this building on October 12, 1910 that Gulfport was given its new name and formally incorporated. The great hurricane of 1921 destroyed the building and its pier along with just about everything else on the waterfront in the area.

The second Casino was built in 1923, and was a rather flimsy structure on piers, over marshy land close to shore, with only a walking pier out to it. It was reported that it actually swayed under the one-step and when a square dance was in progress, everyone wondered if the floor would hold up under all those stomping feet. When the building no longer met building code regulations, it was condemned and torn down.

Determined not to make the same mistake, the new building was built on concrete and steel piers, with the area under the building backfilled and surrounded by a seawall to insure stability. The current Casino was built in 1934, and dedicated in December 1935 as a project of the Federal Economic Rehabilitation Administration. It has been a major landmark and symbol of Gulfport ever since. The hard maple dance floor is reputed to be the best in the south and has weathered many activities beyond dancing. At one time, not so very long ago, they even held boxing and wrestling matches and gymnastics in the Casino. But its chief claim to fame is still an evening of waltzes, foxtrots, cha-chas and a recent revival of swing dancing. Of course in the 50's it became very popular for holding "sock hops" for that new rage rock-n-roll.

The building has seen many changes to its structure including splitting the original single front entrance into two and adding the band shell stage in the center. Ever wonder about that roof line on the water side, where it is so high and squared off? That end, where the bar is today, housed a stage and fly loft. The high roof allowed for curtains and sets to be pulled up out of view and different sets and curtains to be lowered for scene changes during stage productions. Designated an Historical Structure by the City of Gulfport's Historic Preservation Board, the restoration and revitalization is looked forward to with great hope for its continued success and survival well into the new millennium.

CASINO RENOVATION AND RESTORATION

The Gulfport Casino renovation consists of interior and exterior improvements. The actual construction started in the Fall of 2000 with a complete re-roofing of the facility. Additionally, work was performed beneath the building on each of the foundation piers. These repairs were performed first, to maintain the structural integrity of the building.

In May 2001, the city of Gulfport will again temporarily close the Casino for renovation. The work at this time will be significant. The doors and windows will be changed to bring back the original look of the building. Additionally, on the west side there will be an awning installed over an enlarged wooden dock area. This will help distinguish the west door as the new main entrance to the facility, as well as provide a cover for those entering the building during inclement weather.

The south dock will also see some changes. The seawall around the perimeter of the south dock will be



repaired. The deck itself will have a 2-toned appearance, as a color pattern will be established on the concrete decking. A landscape area is also planned on the south side to soften the appearance of this patio.

Some of the interior improvements may not be very noticeable to the patrons of the Casino. The building will be completely re-wired and new air conditioning units installed. All of the existing fire sprinkler piping and air conditioning will be relocated above the ceiling tile. The restroom facilities will be completely remodeled with all new fixtures.

The most striking change on the interior of the building will be the opportunity for patrons to look out of the south windows of the Casino and enjoy the view of Boca Ciega Bay. To accomplish this, the existing bar and storage supply area will be relocated. The bar will move closer to the catering kitchen. The existing wall paneling will be taken down and the original vertical wood wall treatment will again be displayed. New carpet and fresh paint inside and out will assuredly give this facility a newly renovated appearance.

The Gulfport Historical Society is a non-profit association dedicated to the operation of the Gulfport Historical Museum, where data and artifacts concerning the history of Gulfport are collected, preserved, and exhibited. The Gulfport Historical Museum is located at 5301 28th Avenue South and serves as a resource of research material for both individual citizens and

historians. Our hours of operation are 2PM-4PM Monday through Friday and 10AM-12Noon on Saturday. The Society publishes a quarterly newsletter, a yearly civic calendar, and provides a monthly series of informative programs for its members and guests. In addition, two programs of wide community interest are held annually; the Birthday Bash celebrating the anniversary of Gulfport's incorporation on October 12, 1910, and a Nostalgia Day Open House each March.

The Society and Museum depend entirely on volunteers who serve in every capacity from being a member of a committee, to conducting research and caring for the collection, serving as docents, or fulfilling any of the many tasks necessary to maintain our facilities and continue to raise the funds needed for its operation.

No electricity, TV, cars, airplanes, internet, laser surgery, and the list goes on. I wonder what the year 2101 will bring. 


