

## MORE SIMIANS TAKEN TO ISLE

### Escaped Rhesus Monkeys Are Being Returned in Small Groups

Two more Rhesus monkeys were transferred Thursday from the colony in the nursery at Pasadena to Monkey Island, the outdoor home of the simians at Sixty-fifth street and Thirteenth avenue South. It was from this island that the Rhesus troop of a dozen escaped several weeks ago by swimming the lake, after which they spread themselves all over the golf course and the territory in general, causing a cessation of work on the part of nearly a hundred men who spent hours chasing them before they were finally captured.

The island is heavily covered with underbrush and trees and the monkeys usually are not visible unless one approaches the edge of the lake and whistles. For some reason, however, the monkeys are not so taken up with the idea of remaining on the ground and as a result of experiments with those at the nursery George Peterkin has put one over on them. He cleared a place at the edge of the water yesterday and placed a table on the spot. All yesterday afternoon the monkeys were congregated on the table and would sit there basking in the sun until a quarrel arose. At the first howl from the monkey attacked the whole crowd would leap to the trees and disappear.

#### Row Settled

In the little jungle the row would be settled in some manner then members of the troop would appear one by one, settle on the table, argue awhile and discuss the spectators across the lake. Another quarrel and the same performance would be gone through again.

When the Rhesus troop escaped from the island recently one of them turned up missing and the whole of Pasadena was combed for him. A boy showed up at the nursery a few days ago and told Peterkin the missing monkey was domiciled in a clump of banana trees on the edge of Gulfport. Peterkin hot-footed it to the scene, routed out the monkey and discovered he was not one of the Rhesus troop. He had gotten away from someone in Gulfport. The mystery concerning the whereabouts of the missing Rhesus was cleared up yesterday when Peterkin and Frank Tippen, greens keeper of the Boca Ciega golf course, placed the table on Monkey Island. Tuppen explored the island and found the skeleton of the missing Rhesus. Apparently he contracted pneumonia one cold night and succumbed to the disease.


