

The fishermen would haul their catches up onto the waterfront along Shore Blvd. As the city grew, more diverse types of business opened up in that area and the population grew. The "aroma" of this industry caused the people to "convince" the fishermen to move on up the bay toward Clam Bayou. Here the men dredged out a small harbor and thus began the Gulfport Marina. The complete operation of the Marina and Ship's Store was taken over by the City of Gulfport in 1983. The city continues to revise and improve all aspects of the Marina. Many world travelers as well as Sunday boaters have enjoyed this pretty little harbor.







January 1, 1926, saw the opening of the *ROYAT HOTEL*, Gulfport, Florida. Jack Taylor's luxurious Spanish-style hotel, played host to the great and near great of the mid-1920's including the New York Yankees, along with Babe Ruth. After the bust of 1927, the building was given new life as the Florida Military Academy which closed in 1952. It was reopened once again in 1954 as Stetson University College of Law. During WWII the tower was manned by people like Ethel White (mother of Nathan), who served her tours of duty as a plane spotter.





**GULFPORT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**

Gulfport, in 1926, was the hub of academic activity with its new elementary school opening. There was great excitement as Gulfport Elementary opened Spanish-styled doors to educators, builders, and townspeople. The structure, with its massive arches, two-storied classrooms and balconies overlooking an atrium, was a new, handsome concept for schools. This building, along with St. Petersburg High School may be the only schools left in the area built in the Mediterranean Revival style.

During the Civil War the bayou was a supply point for the "Key West Avengers" as they scouted the "Yankees" stationed on Egmont Key. Later it became a different kind of supply point. With the purchase of the land, that was to become Twin Brooks Golf Course, by a group of men that included Alphonso Capone, Robert Vanella, John Torrio and Jack Guzik, the quiet, secluded little bayou became an easy entry port for small boats. What these boats carried we will leave to your imagination. For many years the Osgood brothers had their boat building business on the edge of this bayou on the spit of land between the bayou and the marina. Today this entire area has been developed into a nature preserve that you must visit to really appreciate.

Originally built as the Methodist Church in 1910, but by 1956 it had become small for the growing congregation. It was donated to the City of Gulfport and moved across the street to its present location for use by the Scouts. After the Scouts moved next door the building was used by the Red Cross and Civil Air Patrol, until the City of Gulfport started the Gulfport Extended Mini Bus (GEMS) service in 1975. When the GEMS office moved out it was leased to the Gulfport Historical Society to develop a museum. A ribbon cutting ceremony on our third "Nostalgia Day", 1984 saw our official opening.
