





One and one-half story Frame Vernacular, 3102 52 Street South is significant as Gulfport's oldest documented structure. Built in 1876 by Joseph Torries, one of the areas first settlers, and moved to its present location in 1886. Torries came to Gulfport in 1874 and purchased a plot of land from James Barnett, Gulfport's first settler. He later created the first recorded subdivision in Gulfport on that land. He was involved in a number of business pursuits opening one of the first stores and was in business with the Disston Land Company when it was attempting to develop the village into a port facility during the 1880s. Restoration work is underway on this most historic of homes.

Queen Anne, 2701 Beach Boulevard, is the only surviving example in Gulfport of this style. Built for the Sackrider family about 1910 by Vincent Leonardy, Gulfport's most prolific builder during the city's early years, it was later given to Sackrider's daughter Kate, who had married John F. Cronkite, Mayor of Gulfport during the mid-1920s. The Cronkite's son, John L. Cronkite was a World War II flying ace, immortalized by war correspondent Ernie Pyle in his book "Here Is Your War". His exploits during the war also inspired the 1940s hit song "Coming In On A wing and A Prayer" and the movie "G.I. Joe".





About Our Theme for 1993

The homes and buildings highlighted in this issue of the Gulfport Historic Calendar were selected from the "Historic Buildings Survey of Gulfport, Florida" that was completed during the past year by Historic Property Associates, Inc. of St. Augustine, Florida. Funding was provided through a grant to the City of Gulfport from the Florida Department of State, obtained from the Florida Historic Preservation Grant Fund. The survey was conducted utilizing the criteria for placement of historic properties on the National Register of Historic Places as a basis for site evaluations.

The City of Gulfport administered the grant and provided aid to the consultants while the Gulfport Historical Society provided well over 200 volunteer hours to help complete the survey.

During the course of the research it was discovered that 401 buildings fit the necessary criteria to be included in the survey. With this issue we have attempted to show examples of each architectural style found to be present in the City. While some have only one of a kind examples, the Frame Vernacular style has 238 examples, including our own Museum making it the most popular. Second place goes to the Bungalow with 88, and third place to the Mediterranean Revival of the 1920's with 53 buildings. Additional information on the survey, is available at the Gulfport Historical Society Museum.
