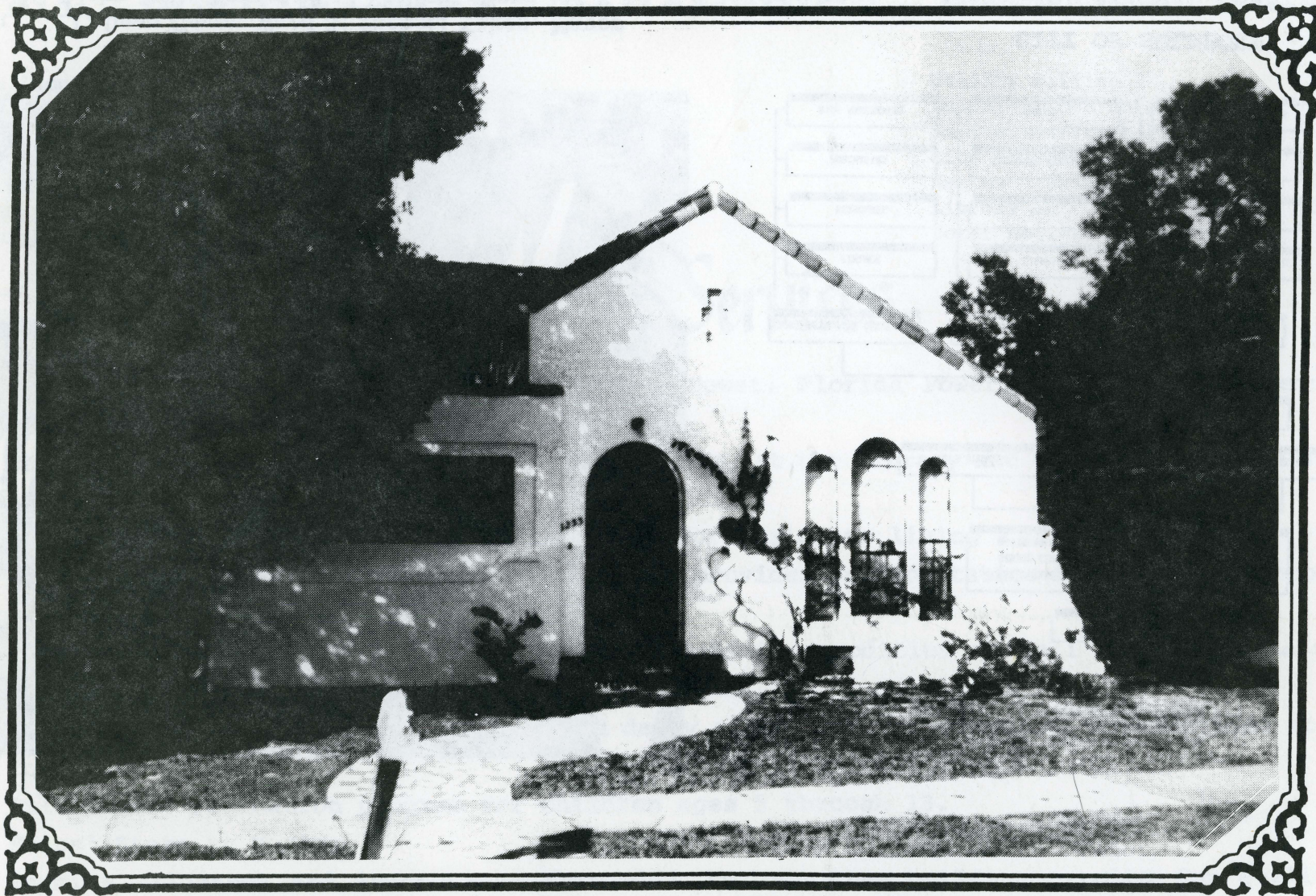

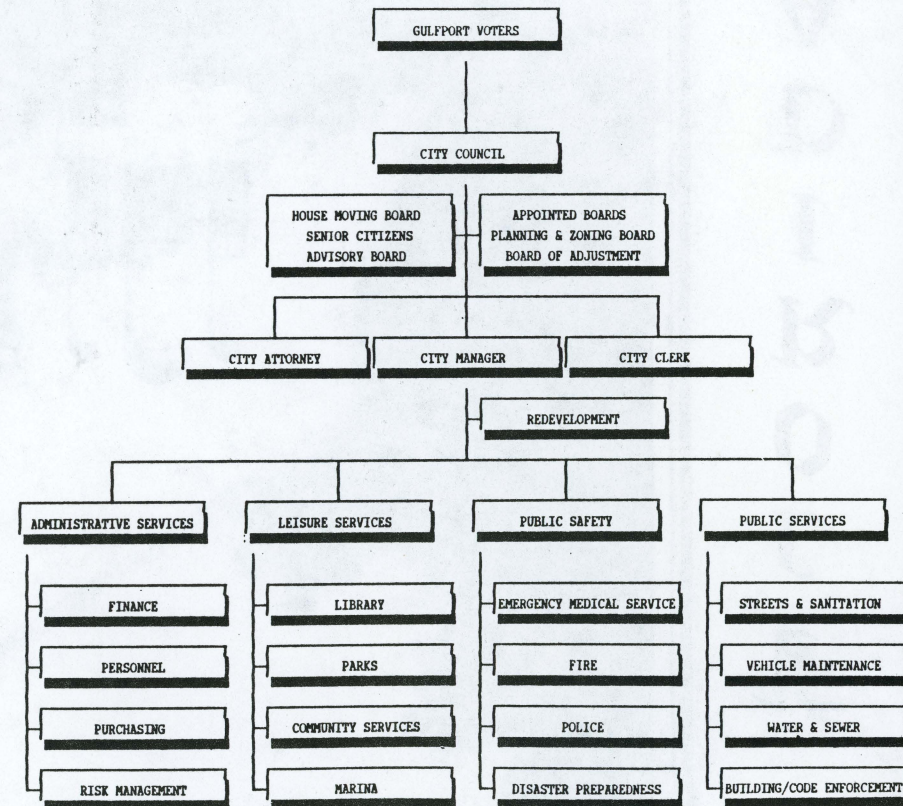

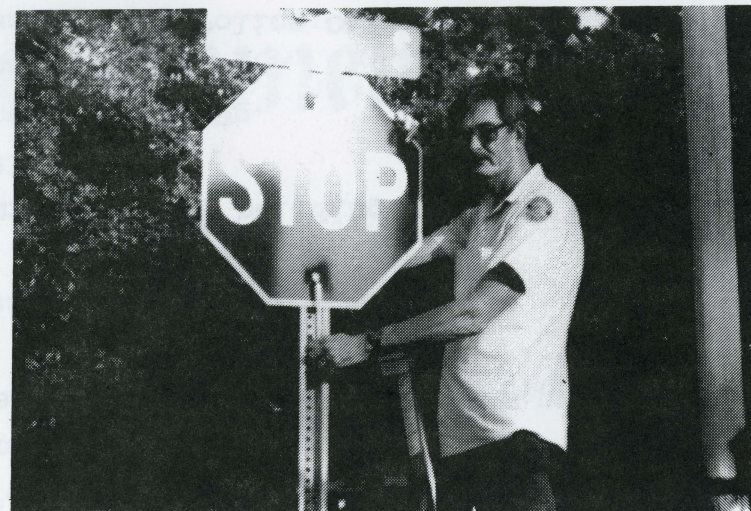
## Special Services

- \* City Hall is the location for paying Water/Sewer, Florida Power, General Telephone, and Paragon Cable bills and REGISTER TO VOTE.
- \* Check out Audio and Video tapes, as well as books, at the Library and attend children's story time and REGISTER TO VOTE.
- \* Reassurance Program providing daily contact for residents living alone.
- \* Gulfport Extended Mini-Bus Service (G.E.M.S.) provides transportation from home to doctor or store for elderly and/or handicapped.
- \* Senior Center provides Congregate Dining and food commodities as well as assistance with Social Services, Social Security and Income Taxes.
- \* Tot Time day care three days a week, and daily after-school recreation, are provided at the Community Center.
- \* Full summer recreation program for children ages 5 through 13.
- \* Ships' Store at Marina.
- \* Permits, licenses and inspections that will include free building permits for qualified rehabilitation projects during the spring of '93.
- \* Free quarterly trash pick-up known as the Quarterly Round-Up.
- \* Police and Fire Explorer Scout programs for ages 14 to 21.
- \* FREE security surveys for City residents and business by Police Officer.

School Crossing Guard Faye Facyson services the corner of 15th Avenue and 52nd Street, stopping traffic as the children go to and from Gulfport Elementary School.





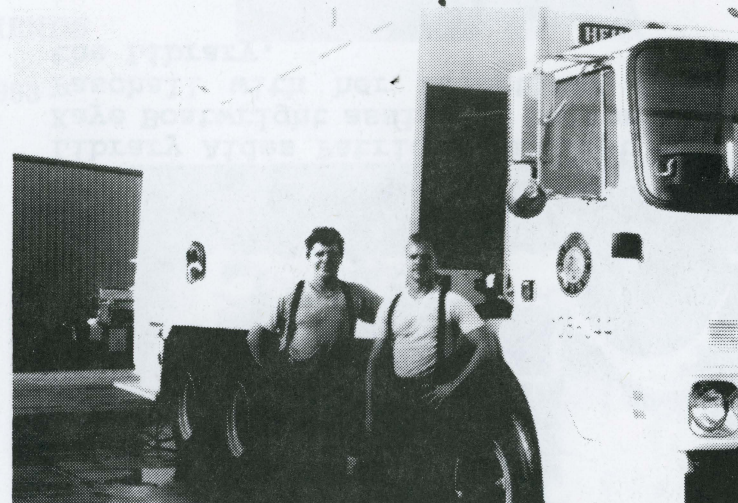

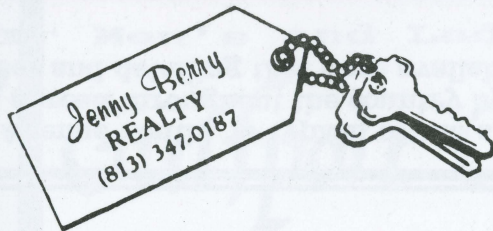




One and one-half story Frame Vernacular, 3102 52 Street South is significant as Gulfport's oldest documented structure. Built in 1876 by Joseph Torries, one of the areas first settlers, and moved to its present location in 1886. Torries came to Gulfport in 1874 and purchased a plot of land from James Barnett, Gulfport's first settler. He later created the first recorded subdivision in Gulfport on that land. He was involved in a number of business pursuits opening one of the first stores and was in business with the Disston Land Company when it was attempting to develop the village into a port facility during the 1880s. Restoration work is underway on this most historic of homes.

Craftsman, 5137 28 Avenue South, is typical of the style of construction in general use from 1905 into the 1920's. The design concepts was spread throughout the country by various popular magazines. Pattern books offered plans and pre-cut packages of lumber and detailing that were available for construction by local labor making this style an inexpensive easy to construct home.

Queen Anne, 2701 Beach Boulevard, is the only surviving example in Gulfport of this style. Built for the Sackrider family about 1910 by Vincent Leonardy, Gulfport's most prolific builder during the city's early years, it was later given to Sackrider's daughter Kate, who had married John F. Cronkite, Mayor of Gulfport during the mid-1920s. The Cronkite's son, John L. Cronkite was a World War II flying ace, immortalized by war correspondent Ernie Pyle in his book "Here Is Your War". His exploits during the war also inspired the 1940s hit song "Coming In On A wing and A Prayer" and the movie "G.I. Joe".

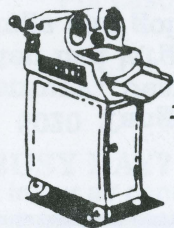

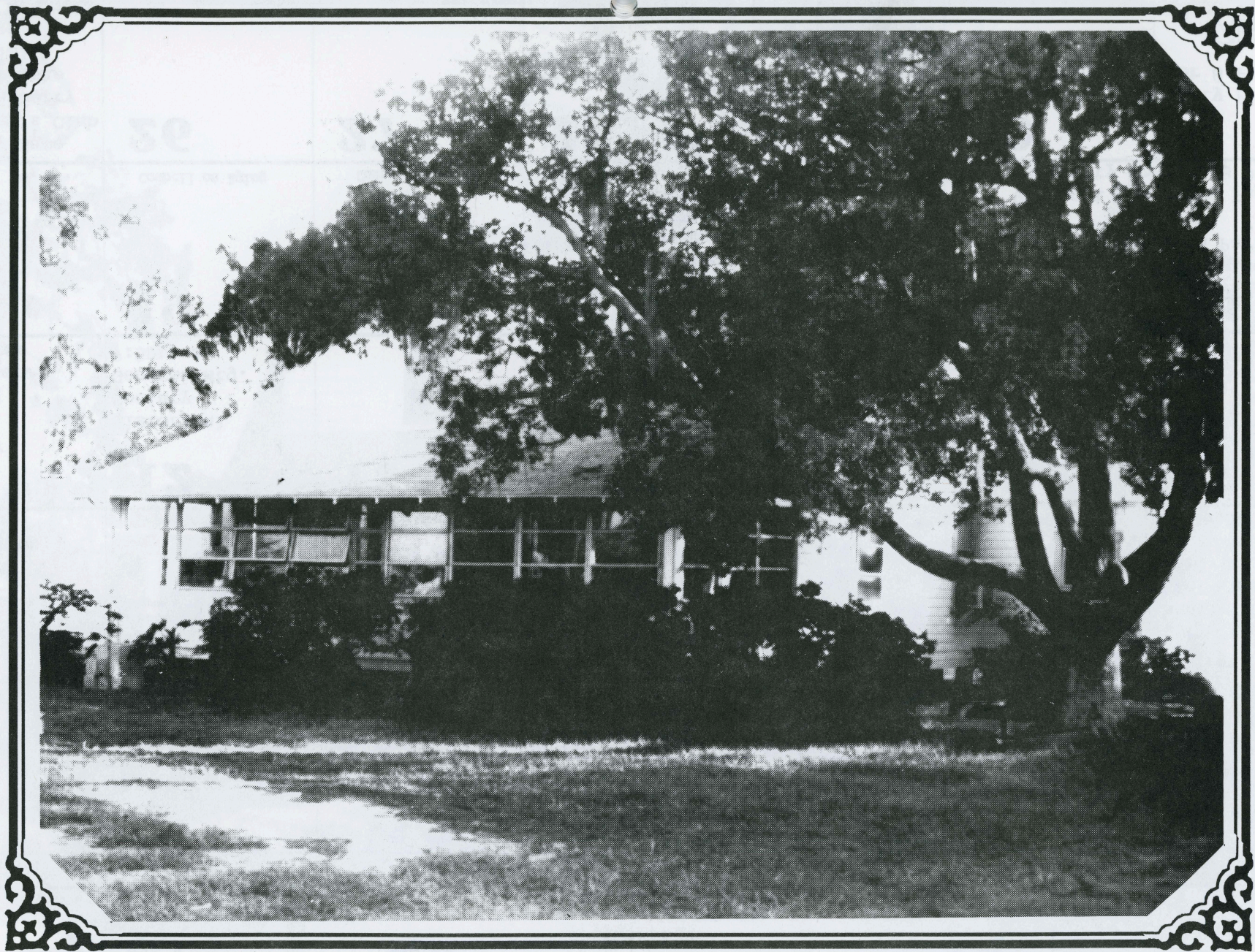

Designed to maximize ventilation with a high pitched roof the houses were set on brick pier foundations and often had large open porches. This home was constructed circa 1900 by the Mills family where it witnessed the daily comings and goings of the trolley.

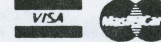

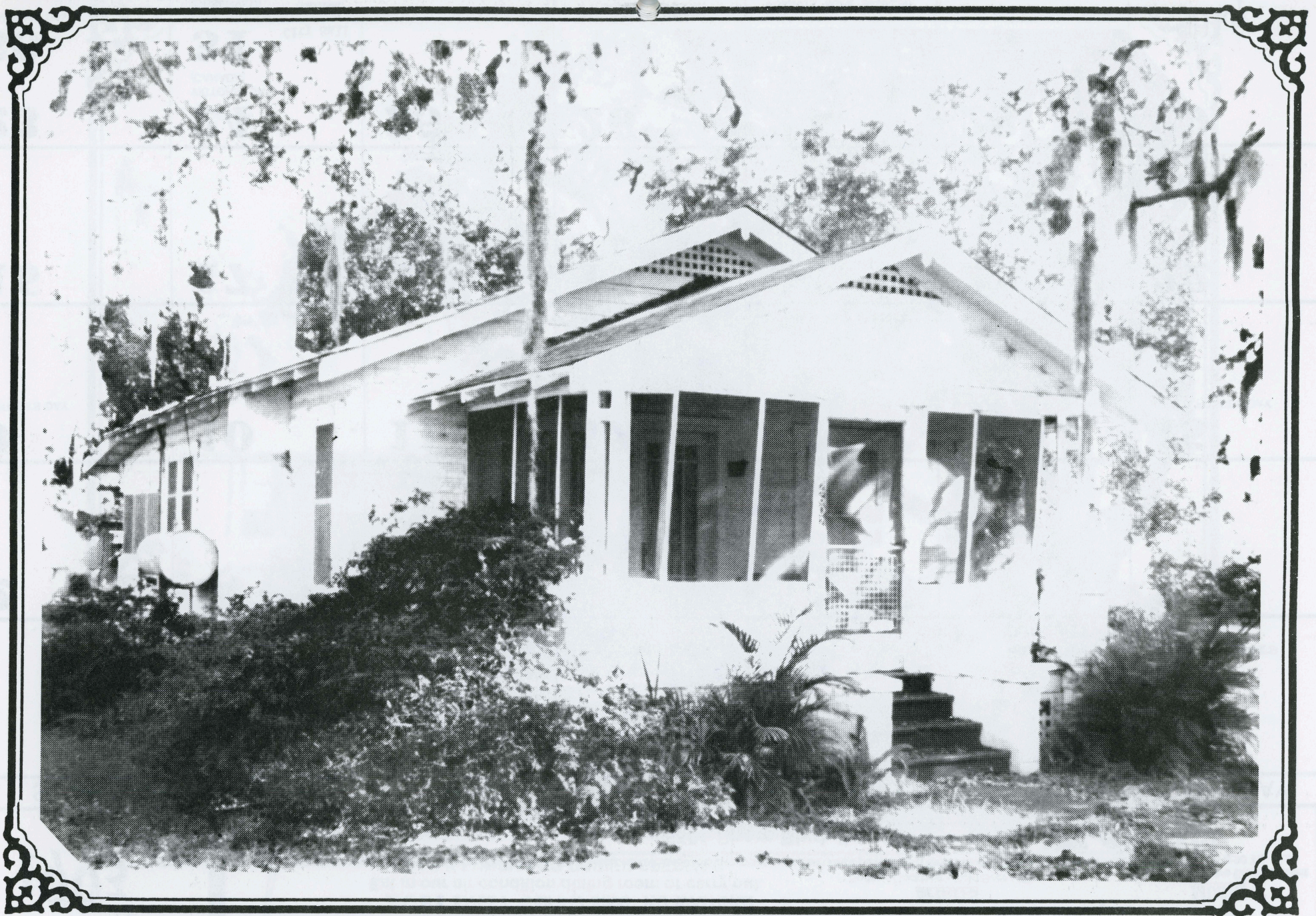

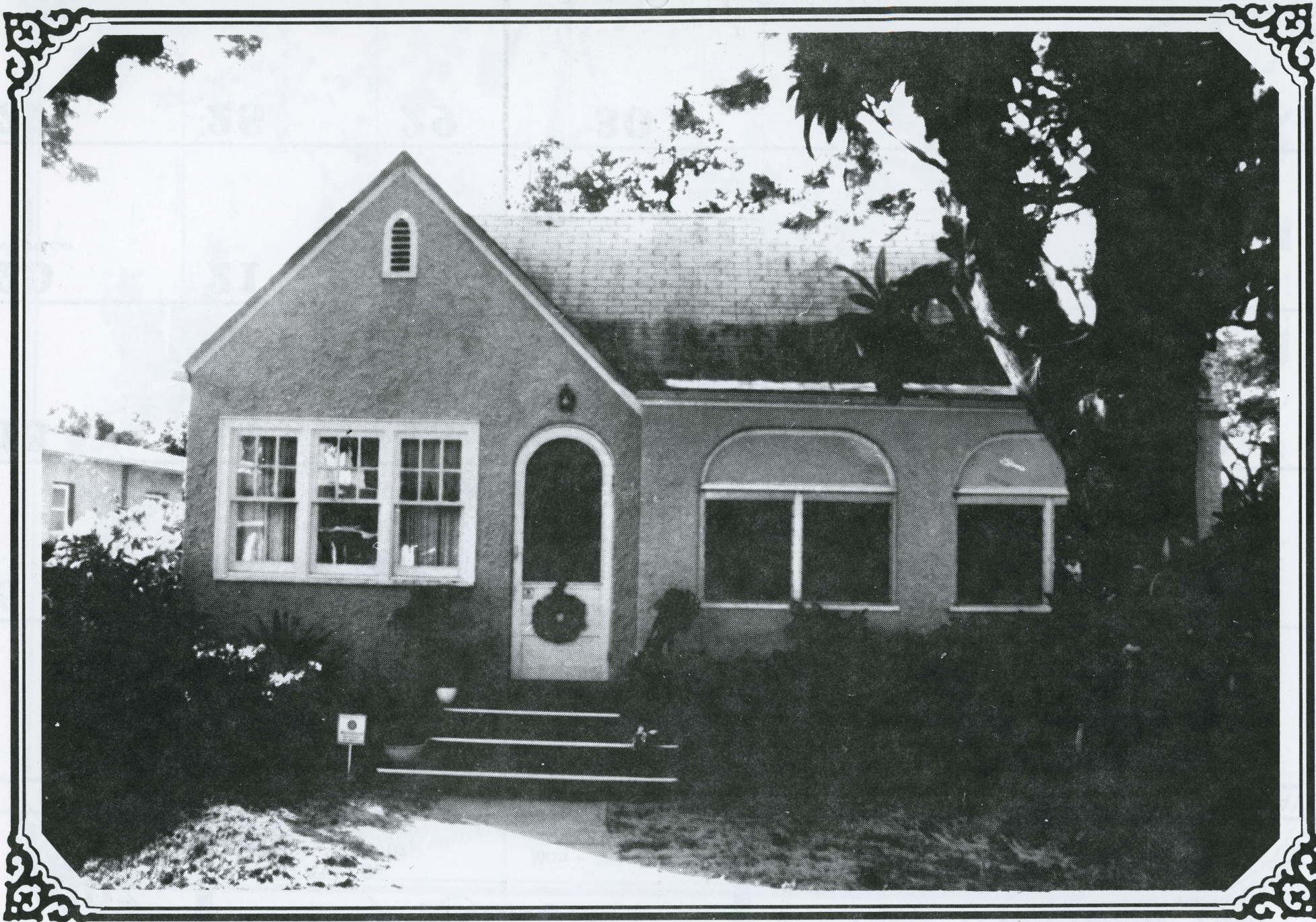

Mediterranean Revival, 6218 10 Avenue South, is significant for its association with the development of the Pasadena Estates section of Gulfport. This exclusive residential subdivision was developed by Jack Taylor, who erected the Rolyat Hotel (Stetson Law School). Designed and constructed in 1924 by local contractor William D. Berry, it became the home of Warren Davis in 1934, who served for a while as president of the Gulfport City Council.

International style, 2917 Clinton Street South, is significant for its association with the development of Gulfport during the Great Depression. This style was the dominant design for commercial and apartment buildings between 1930 and the mid-1970s across America, but was less commonly used for private residences. Architectural evidence based on comparisons with buildings of similar size and design indicates that this residents was constructed circa 1940 and is the only example of this style located in Gulfport.

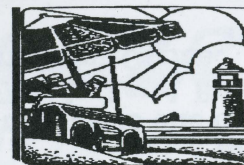

## About Our Theme for 1993

The homes and buildings highlighted in this issue of the Gulfport Historic Calendar were selected from the "Historic Buildings Survey of Gulfport, Florida" that was completed during the past year by Historic Property Associates, Inc. of St. Augustine, Florida. Funding was provided through a grant to the City of Gulfport from the Florida Department of State, obtained from the Florida Historic Preservation Grant Fund. The survey was conducted utilizing the criteria for placement of historic properties on the National Register of Historic Places as a basis for site evaluations.

The City of Gulfport administered the grant and provided aid to the consultants while the Gulfport Historical Society provided well over 200 volunteer hours to help complete the survey.

During the course of the research it was discovered that 401 buildings fit the necessary criteria to be included in the survey. With this issue we have attempted to show examples of each architectural style found to be present in the City. While some have only one of a kind examples, the Frame Vernacular style has 238 examples, including our own Museum making it the most popular. Second place goes to the Bungalow with 88, and third place to the Mediterranean Revival of the 1920's with 53 buildings. Additional information on the survey, is available at the Gulfport Historical Society Museum.
