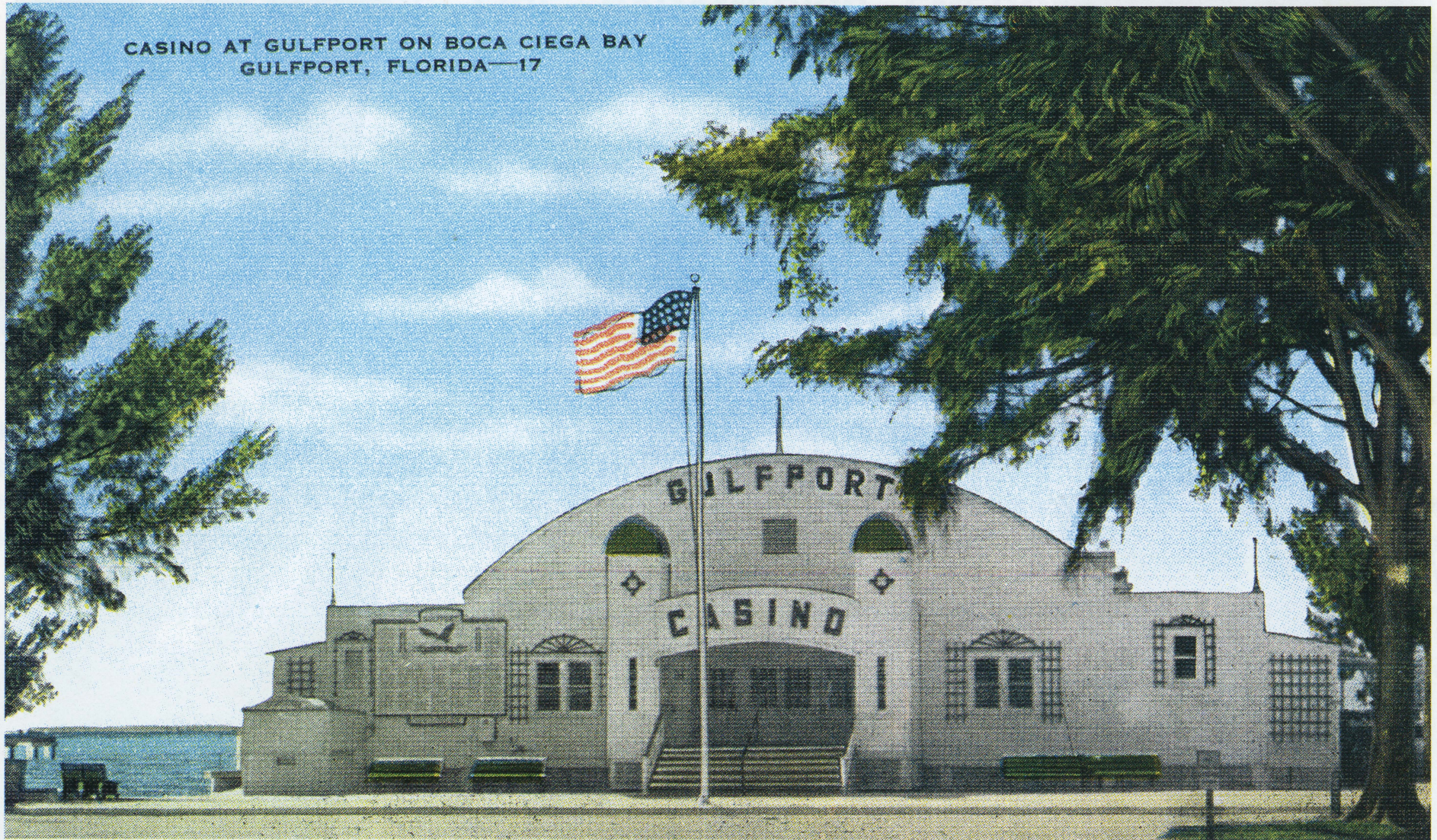


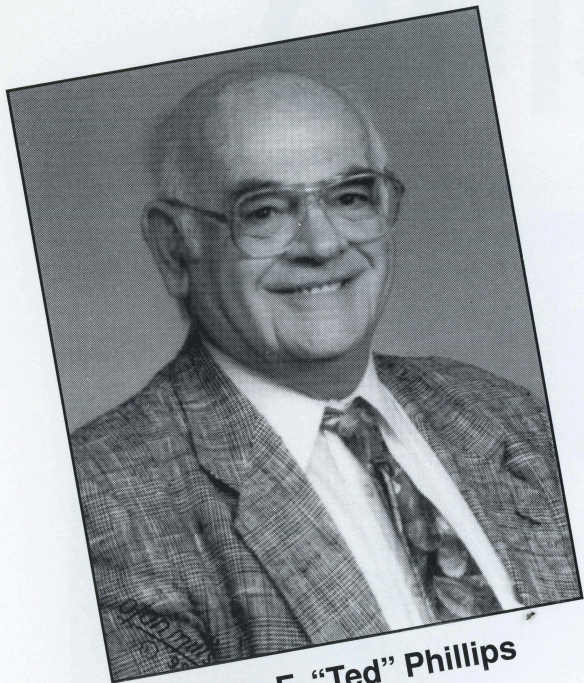

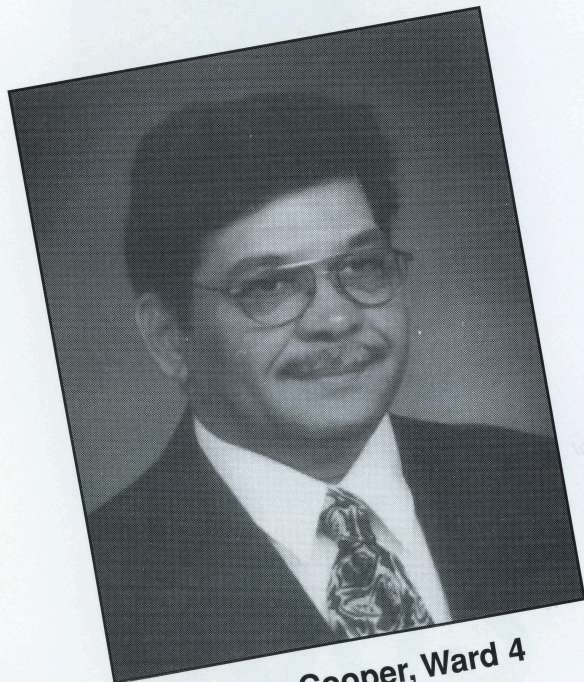

"The Bert and Walter Williams Pier of Gulfport"

The naming of the Gulfport Pier for Bert and Walter Williams represents an opportunity for the City of Gulfport to honor two significant people in our community's heritage. These two men, a father and son, were instrumental in the development of Gulfport. They placed Gulfport first and foremost in their efforts, serving as City officials for a combined tenure of over twenty-seven years.

HENRY WALTER WILLIAMS (1887-1957)

Walter Williams was elected Councilmember in 1940 and became Mayor in 1946. When he retired from public office in 1954, he was given the title "Honorary Councilman for Life."

"Captain Walt" was a skilled fishing guide in Gulfport and an expert on reading the weather and the water. Many old timers have fond memories of the times spend on the "Don" with Capt. Walt. He was married to Inez Green, and the couple had two sons, Walter and Henry (Bert), and a daughter, Maggie Belle.

Walt Williams worked long and hard for our community, and of his many successes, this was his greatest: *he made a friend of everyone he met.*

HENRY (BERT) WILLIAMS (1913-)

Bert Williams was elected Councilmember from Ward II in 1975. He served in that position until 1987 when he won the office of Mayor, which he held for the next four years. Bert is known for his candor and quick wit and his love of Gulfport.

Bert has lived all of his life in Pinellas County, with the exception of the period in the late 1940s and early 1950s when he worked on a railroad in the Northeast. He and his wife Jo have two daughters, Peggy and Debbie.

His devotion to the good of Gulfport is legendary, and like his father, he has the love and respect of all who have known him.

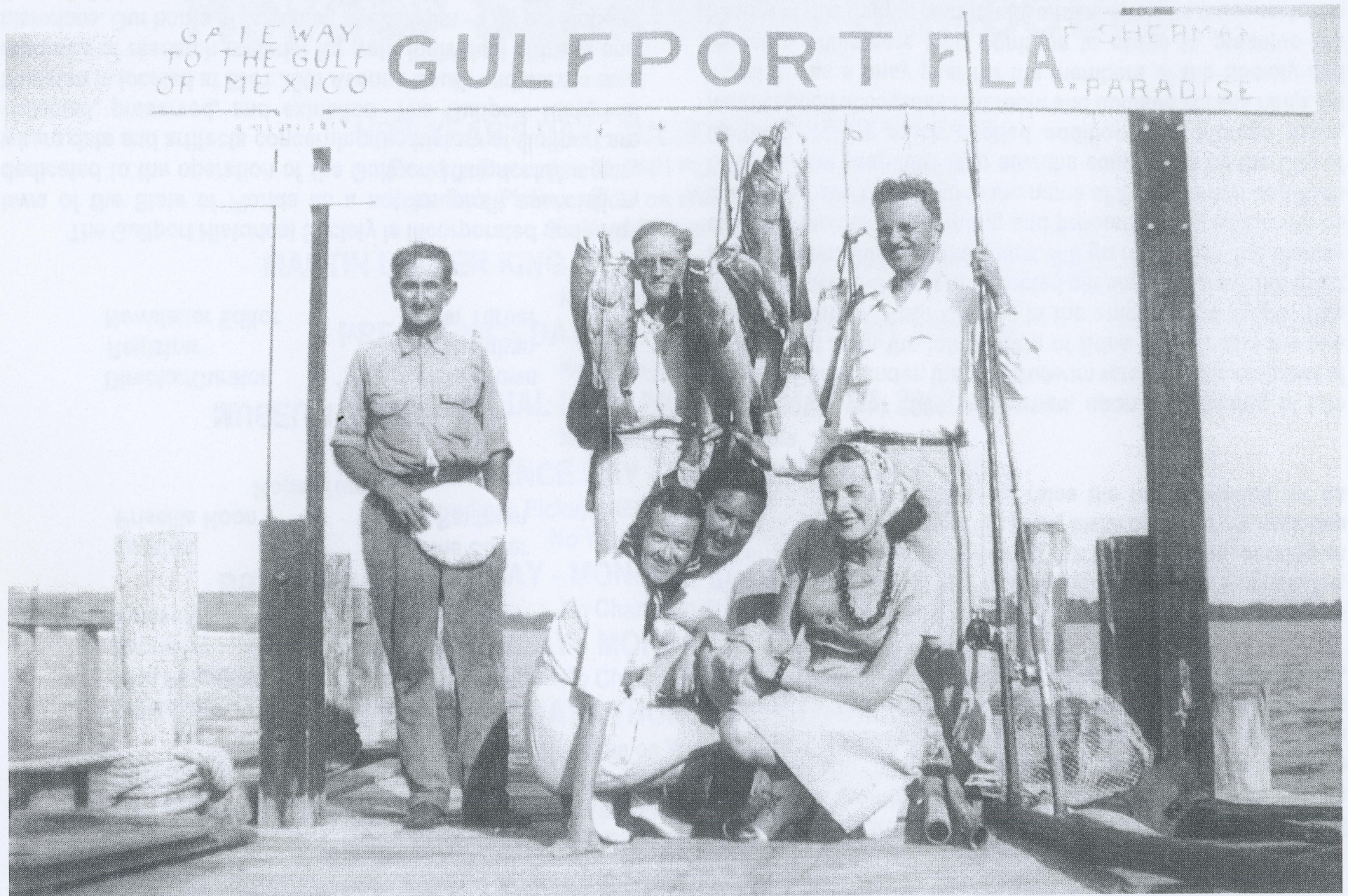

The Gulfport Historical Society is incorporated under the laws of the State of Florida as a not for profit association, dedicated to the operation of the Gulfport Historical Museum, where data and artifacts concerning the history of Gulfport are collected, preserved, and exhibited. The Gulfport Historical Museum is located at 5301 28th Avenue South and serves as a resource of research material for both individual citizens and historians. Our hours of operation are 2:00 pm - 4:00 pm Monday through Friday and 10:00 am - 12 noon on Saturday. The Society

publishes a quarterly newsletter, a yearly civic calendar, and provides a monthly series of informative programs for its members and guests. In addition, two programs of wide community interest are held annually; the Birthday Bash celebrating the anniversary of Gulfport's Incorporation on October 12, 1910, and a Nostalgia Day Open House each March.

The Society and Museum depend entirely on volunteers who serve in every capacity from being a member of a committee, to conducting research and caring for the collection, serving as docents, or fulfilling any of the many tasks necessary to maintain our facilities and continue to raise the funds needed for its operation.

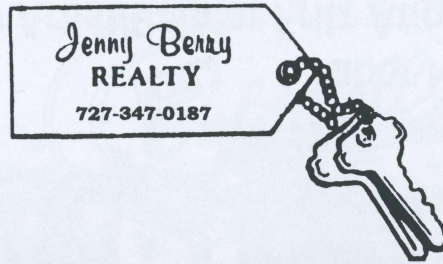
In the year 2001 we learned, upon the passing of Life Member Edna Sandor, that the Museum was to be the recipient of an bequest from the joint estate of Edna Sandor and the late Councilmember, Ruth Cooper in the amount of \$10,000. This much needed and most unexpected gift was received with great appreciation. Some of the funds will go to refinish the display cabinets including repainting and proper lighting which will be completed and dedicated in the name of Edna Sandor and Ruth Cooper. The year 2001 also saw the completion by the City of Gulfport, of the much needed addition of a storage room, handicapped accessible rest room and updated access ramp. As usual it was a busy year for the members of the Society and Museum volunteers who continue to strive to preserve the history of this unique community and maintain its museum to the very best of their abilities.
