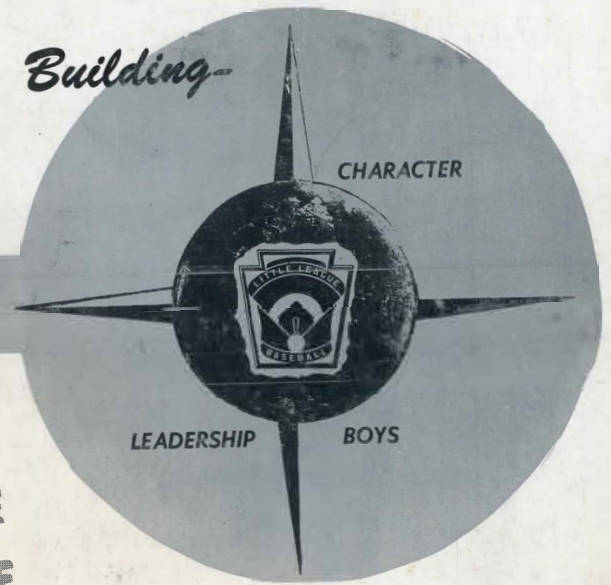

National Little League Baseball Week

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

A Proclamation

Whereas the year 1959 marks the Twentieth Anniversary of Little League Baseball; and

Whereas Little League Baseball has contributed much to a wider interest in the game and encouraged our young people to direct their energies in healthful, competitive team sports; and

Whereas participation in this sport by boys — and by their adult leaders — has helped to develop a feeling of fair play, community spirit and respect for the discipline of rules and decisions; and

Whereas the Congress, by House Concurrent Resolution 17, agreed to June 1, 1959, has authorized and requested the President to proclaim the week beginning the second Monday in June of each year as National Little League Baseball Week, in recognition of the national and community benefits resulting from Little League activities:

Now, Therefore, I, Dwight D. Eisenhower, President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim the week beginning the second Monday in June of 1959, and the week beginning the second Monday in June of each succeeding year, as National Little League Baseball Week.

And I invite the people of the United States to observe such week each year in schools, parks, athletic fields, and other suitable places with appropriate ceremonies and activities designed to further the objectives of our national youth fitness.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the United States of America to be affixed.

Done at the City of Washington this fourth day of June in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fifty-nine and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and eighty-third.

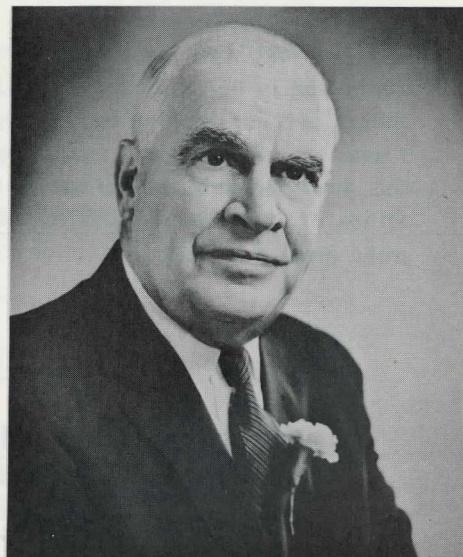

TOURNAMENT PLAY IN LITTLE LEAGUE BASEBALL

The phase of the Little League Program devoted to tournament play provides a normal and uniform climax to the season's play. It is a rewarding and educational experience for the youngster who in most instances is rounding out his final year as a Little Leaguer.

In approaching tournament season it must be recognized that the proper conduct reposes a large measure of responsibility on all concerned. It is the one occasion when the overall proportions of the program come into sharp perspective as the result of concentrated attendance and publicity.

It is of vital importance that the basic platform of ideals, sportsmanship and honor inherent in the local league program be projected in tournament play.

Leagues have the option of not entering or entering Tournament Play. Those Leagues electing to participate must do so in full compliance with the rules, and in scrupulous regard for those unwritten concepts which are the strength of Little League.

Proper regard for authority and respect for the person of the umpire must be emphasized. All games must be played to a decision. Protests arising from judgment decisions cannot be entertained. Managers should be aware of their responsibility to the program and should not resort to protests.

The atmosphere of tournament play must be maintained at the same level as during the local League season. Under these ideal conditions we can look forward to an exemplary tournament program reflecting credit and honor to Little League Baseball.

. . . from only 29 Leagues in this International Program in 1951, with approximately 1700 boys, the enrollment of franchised Leagues has increased to approximately 110 Leagues this season, and over 16,000 boys! !

. . . in 1950, only 306 Leagues, in 1951, 776; in 1955, 3,976 and this season, over 5,200, with an estimated enrollment of boys in excess of 750,000 boys! ! !

. . . and INTERNATIONALLY:

. . . Little League Baseball is now a truly world-wide movement, bringing baseball in its finest concept to thousands of eager youngsters in every section of the globe. In addition to every province of Canada, this season's edition of the Little League World Series, will have teams representing three other regions outside the United States. Teams are playing in franchised Leagues in Alaska, our 49th State, the Canal Zone, Guam, France, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Cuba, Mexico, Venezuela, England, Germany, Morocco, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Japan, the Phillipines, Korea, Australia, Thailand, Okinawa. Interest has spread to Hong Kong, Taiwan and India.

Little League Baseball continues to grow at an unprecedented rate. But MORE IMPORTANT; it is making a real contribution to the Character and Leadership qualities of the boys who are privileged to participate — the future citizens of our Nation.

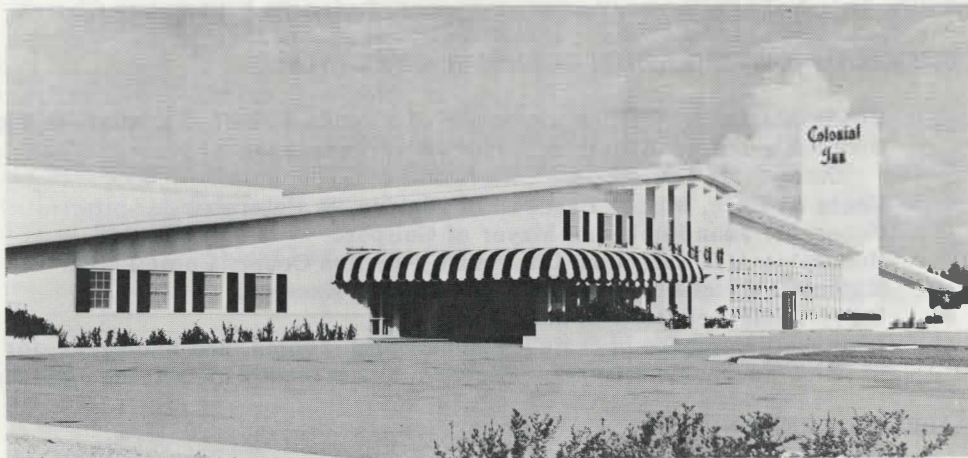

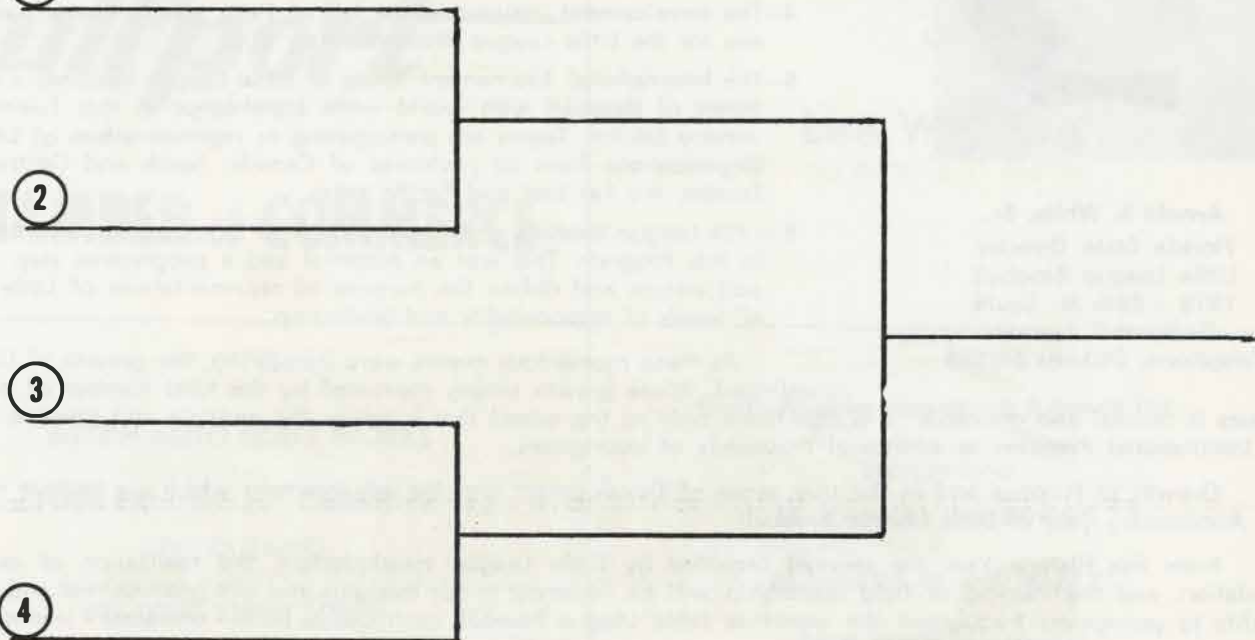

- 1—Early in 1959 both Houses of Congress gave solid support to Little League by passage of a joint Resolution of Endorsement.
- 2—The President's Proclamation gave the Highest Level of Endorsement to this world-wide movement by the establishment of an annual Little League Baseball Week.
- 3—Plans developed in 1958 were placed into action to construct a permanent Headquarters Building in Williamsport, Pa.
- 4—The development initiated in the fall of 1958 was continued on a suitable site for the Little League World Series.

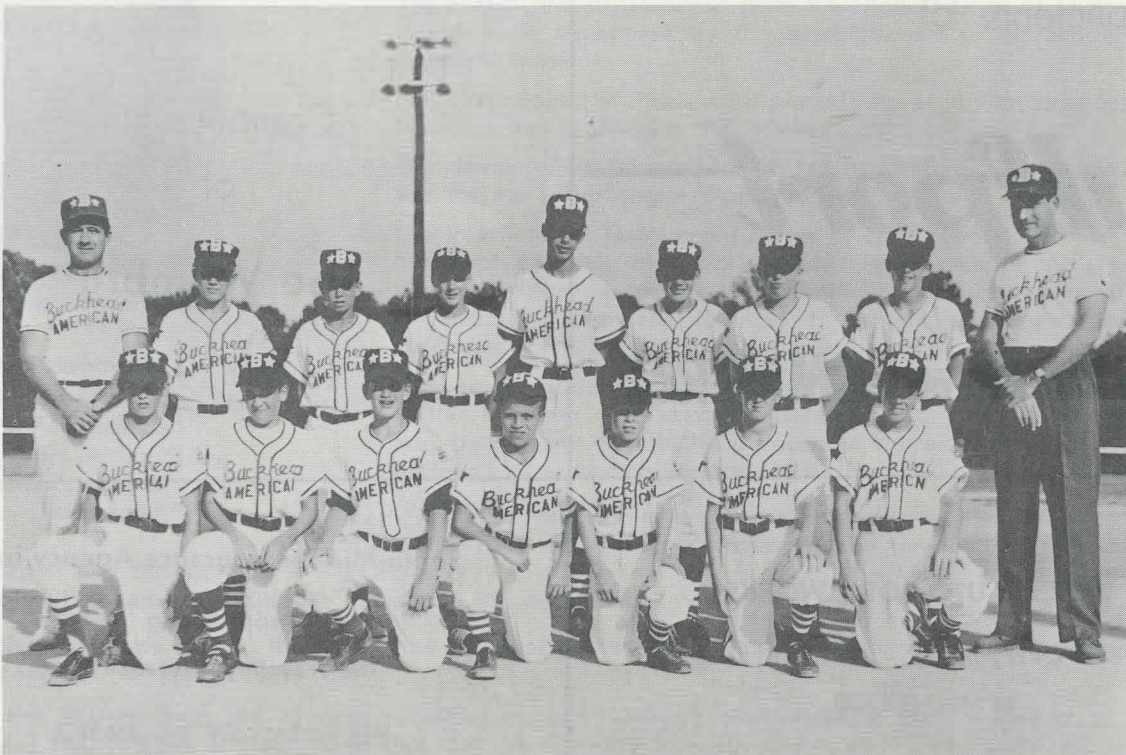
