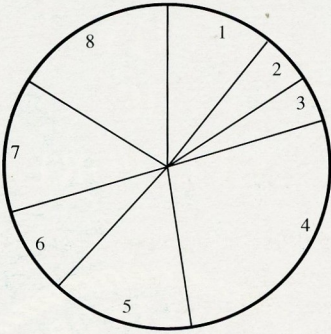

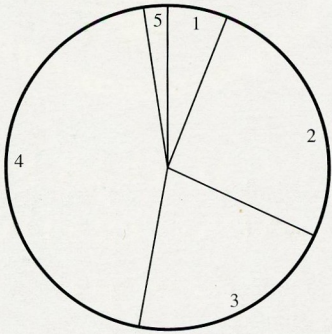

# FISCAL YEAR 1992 ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES AND 1993 GOALS

## INCREASE PUBLIC SAFETY

### 1992 RESULTS

- Implemented 1st phase of 6-year city-wide fire protection program by installing new water line on 49th Street (Tangerine Avenue to 20th Avenue).
- Dedicated an extra 623 hours to police foot patrol, 823 hours to problem specific police patrol and 435 hours to covert surveillance.
- Filled all police vacancies, resulting in a fully staffed police department for the first time in several years.
- Worked with Pinellas County and the City of St. Petersburg to complete 49th Street/Gulfport Boulevard intersection improvements.

### 1993 GOALS

- Increase police personnel to provide for more police patrol and surveillance.
- Implement second year of capital program to upgrade the city's water supply and hydrant system.
- Complete engineering work on intersection improvements at 15th Avenue/49th Street and 11th Avenue/49th Street, and on widening 58th Street from 11th Avenue to 7th Avenue.
- Compile demographic information necessary for post-disaster funding applications.

## ENHANCE QUALITY OF LIFE

### 1992 RESULTS

- Purchased four new sanitation trucks, a new EMS squad truck, and a new fire truck to improve city-wide sanitation, emergency medical, and fire protection services.
- Approved preliminary design work for the library expansion project and the multi-year marina improvement project.
- Established a police explorers group and increased the number of summer employment opportunities for city teens.
- Published a comprehensive Leisure Services Activity Program on services and events.

### 1993 GOALS

- Adopt a comprehensive stormwater management plan and pursue a reclaimed water agreement.
- Implement a city-wide yard waste recycling program.
- Proceed with engineering and permitting for the municipal marina project and secure state/federal grants for the library renovation project.
- Provide an after-school program, further increase summer jobs for teens, and continue to provide support for the Senior Citizens Advisory Committee.

## IMPROVE CITY AESTHETICS

### 1992 RESULTS

- Implemented 1st phase of a 5-year city-wide sidewalk improvement program with over 75,000 square feet of new or-replacement sidewalk completed.
- Replaced the city's fueling facility with new environmentally approved fuel pumps and tanks.
- Initiated a new program designed to "blitz" targeted neighborhoods to identify code violations.
- Renovated the Leisure Services/Rehearsal Hall Building, installed new turf grass at Hoyt Field and worked with the Historical Society volunteers to complete a city historical survey.

### 1993 GOALS

- Initiate a bimonthly sweeping program for all publicly owned streets and alleys.
- Continue to upgrade brick and asphalt streets, and initiate an alley upgrade program.
- Complete engineering work on a new police facility and renovations to the municipal complex.
- Adopt a redevelopment plan for the now established Redevelopment District and work with Keep South Pinellas Beautiful, Inc. on city-wide clean-up efforts.
