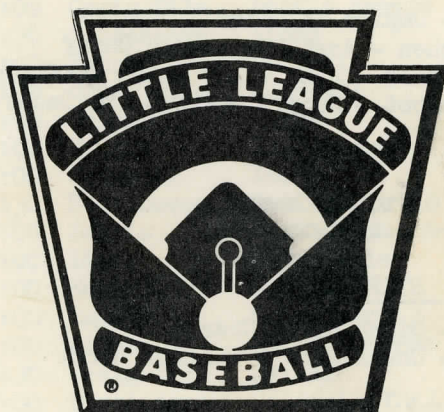

### CALLED and TIED GAMES

Games called on Monday or Tuesday will be played Wednesday at 5:30. Games called on Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday will be played on Saturday, the first game called at 7:00, the second at 5:00, the third at 3:00.

If 4 or more innings have been completed when a game must be called, it is an official game, unless the score is tied when called. In this case the game will be resumed from the exact point where called. If less than 4 innings have been completed when a game is called, it is no game, and must be replayed from the beginning.

The umpires decision is final as to when a game must be called, except that by Little League Regulation no inning will start after 9:30 PM.

## LITTLE LEAGUE PITCHING REGULATIONS

Pitching is the most strenuous position in baseball - both physically and mentally. These regulations are designed to protect the health of the boys, and to insure that no boy does too much pitching. They explain why a manager must sometimes remove a good pitcher during a game.

A team may not use more than two 12 year old pitchers in any week.  
A team may not use more than five pitchers in any one game.

If a boy pitches in 4 or more innings on any day, he must have three full days rest before he may pitch again.

If a boy pitches in less than 4 innings on any day he must have one full days rest before he may pitch again.

If a boy is removed from the mound during a game, he may not pitch again in that game. He may, however, continue in the game in any other position.

No boy may pitch in more than 6 innings in any week.

In the Minor Leagues, 12 year old boys may not pitch, otherwise the regulations are the same.

LITTLE LEAGUE NEWS - The "Evening Independent" prints each day the line score of the preceeding day's games, with names of pitchers, catchers, and extra base hitters. On either Saturday or Monday they print the standings of the teams, and a list of the 10 leading batters as of the preceeding Wednesday

# ABOUT LITTLE LEAGUE

GULFPORT LIONS LITTLE LEAGUE Inc. was organized in 1953 for the sole purpose of bringing organized baseball to every boy living in Gulfport who is within the age limits, and who will abide by Little League Regulations. During the first few years the League was limited to four teams. Later growth required expansion to six teams and establishment of the Minor League.

The fine playing field has been created over the years by the combined labor of hundreds of parents and friends, and the generous donations by many businesses and organizations, and especially by the Gulfport Lions Club.

The following quotation from "This is Little League" gives the basic objectives of the program:

There is only one reason for Little League: to provide beneficially a program of baseball for boys.

In the process of making it possible for a million boys annually to enjoy and fulfill their formative years, Little League offers a challenge to parents and adults to help cultivate a wholesome, spirited climate in which boys can be stimulated to beneficial habits of physical well being and character development.

Competition and the values inherent in team play and game disciplines are good for boys and equip them better to cope with their advance into manhood. Little League is an action program. A boy must earn the right to be on the team. His attitudes, desire to excel and improve his skills determine whether or not he makes the team. His ability to adapt to teamwork, to take directions and importantly, to learn how to win and lose determines not only whether he remains a member of the team but to what extent he benefits from Little League.

If the program serves this end, if the experience, the association and action lessons which stem from teamwork and the fun of playing, prove of some benefit in the growing-up process of millions of youngsters, Little League fulfills its goal.
