

Know all men by these presents that I John Bap-lat of Frederick County and state of Maryland in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Dollars to me in hand part by Jacob Shriver of the same County and state aforementioned at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipts whereof I the said John Baplat do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the [ ]Mr [ ] Jacob Shriver his executors administrators and [assigns] two certain negro children, named King Gerge and Henry King George aged five years the sixth day of January past and he is black, and Henry was one year old the twentyeth of last November and he is a molatto to have and to hold the said negro children, slaves named King George and Henry above bargained and sold to the Jacob Shriver his executors administrators and [assigns] forever. And I the said John Baplat for myself, my heirs, executors, and administrators the said negro children name of King George and Henry as slaves unto the said Jacob Shriver his executors and assigns against me the said John Baplat my executors and administrators, and against all and every other person and persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and we defend by these presents.
