Information from Richard Pettler Born in Canton Center, Connecticut Feb 19, 1835. She graduated from Mount Holyoke College and then taught school in NYC and Connecticut. After her marriage to Charles Farnam in 1863 she lived in Westfield, CT. Upon moving to San Francisco with her husband in 1872, she studied locally at the School of Design under Virgil Williams and Raymond Yelland, and privately with William Keith and George Smilie. In the mid 1870's she moved across the bay to Oakland. She made painting excursions to the Monterey Peninsula, Santa Cruz and Yosemite. By 1900 she was a Many of her paintings were lost in the 1906 earthquake and fire making rare any that are extant. She was exhibited at California State Fair, 1881-1901; Mechanics' Institute (SF)1885-97; SFAA 1885-1905' California Building World's Columbian Expo ( Chicago) 1893 There is a Farnam Street three blocks away so it possible that the Cohen family knew her.
