- List written by Donald A Cohen of family letters recovered from estate of Alice McDonald Cohen [widow of William Cohen]. Some notes written on brown envelope, other notes on sepia tone paper
- 4. List of books from the estate of Alice McDonald Cohen with note presumed by Donald A Cohen stating list me by U.S. Webb "purporting dated auction sale which was called off." 9 typed pages
- 5. "Heart-Faith" Sermon by W. H. Furness, First Unitarian Church in Philadelphia, dated Nov 11, 1894. Note from Emilie with quote from Dr Furness a diff sermon?
- 6. Handwritten copy of a poem
- 7. Handwritten copy of hymn "Rock of Ages"
- 8. One page of handwritten letter from E.G. Cohen with travel plans: "I go to NY on Wed May 8th, leave NY Thursday May 9th at 5:30 pm due in San Francisco Mon 13th at 7:28 pm."
- 9. Letter to Emilie dated Feb 25, 1880 from address 142 East 80th Street, NY; cannot decipher sender signature
- 10. Handwritten note: "Happy is the man who in his western home Spans time and space and finds himself in Rome"
- 11. Three dates torn from daily calendar: March 24, 26, and 27 no year
- 12. Two handwritten letters to Emilie from her brother in law Henry Cohen date looks like 1866
- 13. Diary of Emilie about a stay at LaCrescenta Gould 'Castle' with son William and his wife Alice; 8 handwritten pages, both sides on rough brown paper. Some pages are torn out and some pages seem to be missing.

- 15. Typewritten letter to Edie (Edith Cohen) from Henry Gibbons, her grandfather, dated Oct 31, 1877

- 19. Handwritten poems presumed author Emilie Cohen; sepia tone note paper with "Fernside" at top and monogram "EGC" in left corner, 1 page both sides

- 20. "Runnymede" hymn handwritten on sepia tone note paper; says at bottom "Hymn written by Joyce Greer Harrison in honor of Emilie Ethel Cohen which was sung at her wedding, Jun 2, 1894"

- 35. Hardback journal matches above; includes handwritten chronology of AA Cohen's death written by Emilie Cohen and handwritten copy of autopsy report 1887
- 36. "Emilie G Cohen vs La Canada Land and Water Trust: Reply brief of Appellant-Supreme Court of the State of California" re: water rights dispute for Gould Castle at La Crescenta, CA
