The republican national convention at Chicago nominated for the presidential office a statesman whose work has contributed no small share to the prestige and success of the party. In a long and honorable career in the halls of legislation he has been a leader on the right side of every issue. The people have found him a faithful, a capable and an upright public servant. And the republican party is no less fortunate in having for its nominee for Vice-President that brilliant soldier and eminent statesman, John A. Logan.

In the decision of the canvass New York will exert a mighty influence. The result of the contest may be determined by the action and vote of the Empire state. The responsibility must be clearly understood and cannot be evaded. The prospect for success is most encouraging. Faction's voice is no longer heard in the party's councils; unity and harmony prevail; their influence must be intensified and effectually applied by thorough organization and well-directed, unremitting effort till the polls are closed. In every city, in every village, hamlet and school district the republicans should perfect their organization without delay, and make the canvass thorough. With such effort, immediate, well sustained, it is certain New York's electoral vote will be cast for the national republican candidates.
