For veterans, returning home from war can be both an exhilarating and challenging experience. Through private correspondence from almost every major conflict in U.S. history, *War Comes Home: The Legacy* offers insight into the thoughts and emotions of veterans and their families upon their homecoming. These intimate perspectives - from the Civil War era through the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq - reveal how war can shape a life, a family, and a community.



Hear the Letters: Cell Phone Audio Tour

War Comes Home: The Legacy features an audio tour of selected authors and actors reading fuller versions of each letter in English and Spanish. You can use your own cell phone to access the audio tour while in the exhibition, or you can call the audio tour from any phone, at any time, to listen again after your visit.

The audio tour is free, except for your cell phone minute or long distance usage. You may remain connected throughout your visit, or hang up and call back as often as you like during your visit or at home.

Escuche las cartas: Audioguía por teléfono.

La exposición de La guerra llega al hogar: El legado cuenta con una audioguía para escuchar la exposición en español. Puede usar su propio teléfono celular para acceder a la audioguía mientras se encuentra en la exposición, o puede acceder a la audioguía desde cualquier teléfono y a cualquier hora después de su visita.

La audioguía es gratuita, excepto para el uso de los minutos en su teléfono celular, ya sean nacionales o de larga distancia. Puede permanecer conectado/a a lo largo de su visita o colgar y hablar nuevamente tantas veces como usted lo desee durante su visita o desde su casa.

To access the War Comes Home: The Legacy audio tour:

1. Call: 415-900-4461
2. Press: the number of the audio and the # key
3. Listen: to the letters written by veterans and their friends and family.

For example, to hear Lieutenant Commander Todd Vorenkamp read his letter, dial 415-900-4461, and then press 7 and the # key.
