Be it known and it is certified and made manifest hereby to all whom the same doth or may concern that this eighteenth day of August in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty and of the Independence of the United States of America, the fifty fifth, in the House of His Excellency William C. Rives Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the said United States to the Court of France: before me Isaac Cox Burnett, Consul of the said United States for Paris &c.
