My dear children upon returning from Europe.

I can tell you how much grief
Aunt Ann's accident with the cannon has given me.
I had such pride in escorting her to the end of her journey
with safety - Mamma & I go to Statburgh this
afternoon to return on Monday & go on directly
to Washington where I will pass two days &
then return with no more expedition than Mamma's
comforts will permit. I am glad I am removed
from my own table & its guests until you can
be present to hear all the incidents of
my travel. I will write again from
Washington -

I have suggested to George to take
Mary with him to Boston. She wants
change of air & and may relieve you.
Your dear Daughter will be here for
on Thursday afternoon with Fanny &
their nurse. They are quite well. Philip
has grown he and then today
