My dear Son



I have great pleasure in enclosing to you a letter from your dear mother who is in the enjoyment of the very best health she could desire. She came here ten days ago when we have remained until this day with the exception of our visit to N.Y. to attend a Yorkens dinner - The farm stock is well improved and 21 wethers in order to settle with the late and to come in with the appreciation with those who are to come here on the 19th.
