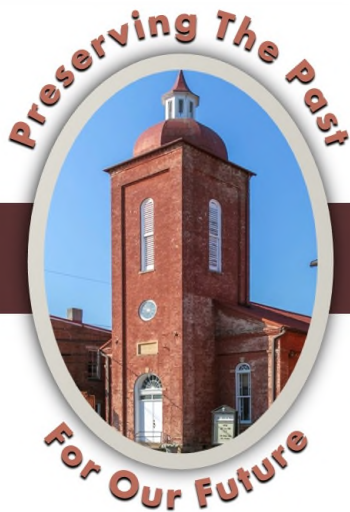

No more late nights on week-days, no more sleeping until noon, no more Lake White — basically no more freedom.

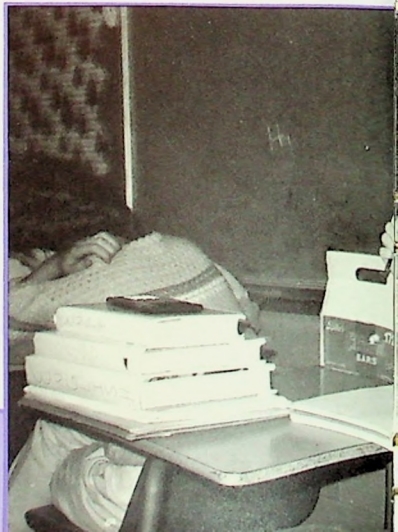
It sounded a little bit like death and felt like it, but it was the end of summer.

A fantasy is the mental image a person imagines not present to the senses. We all have fantasies.

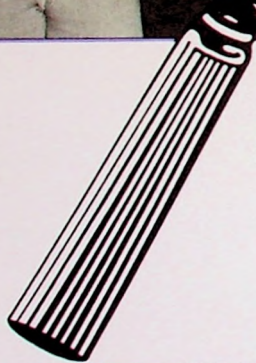
Girls dream about dating that special guy, becoming a homecoming queen or cheerleader, or getting the lead in the play.

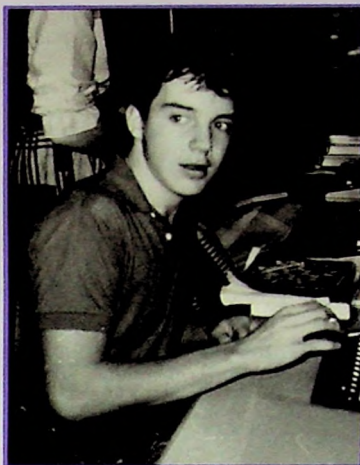

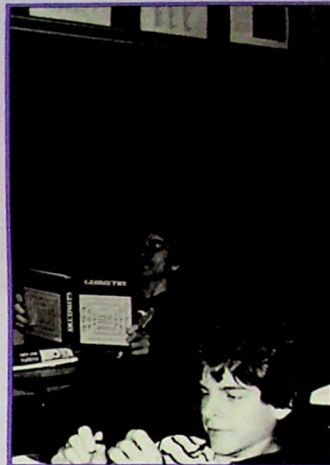

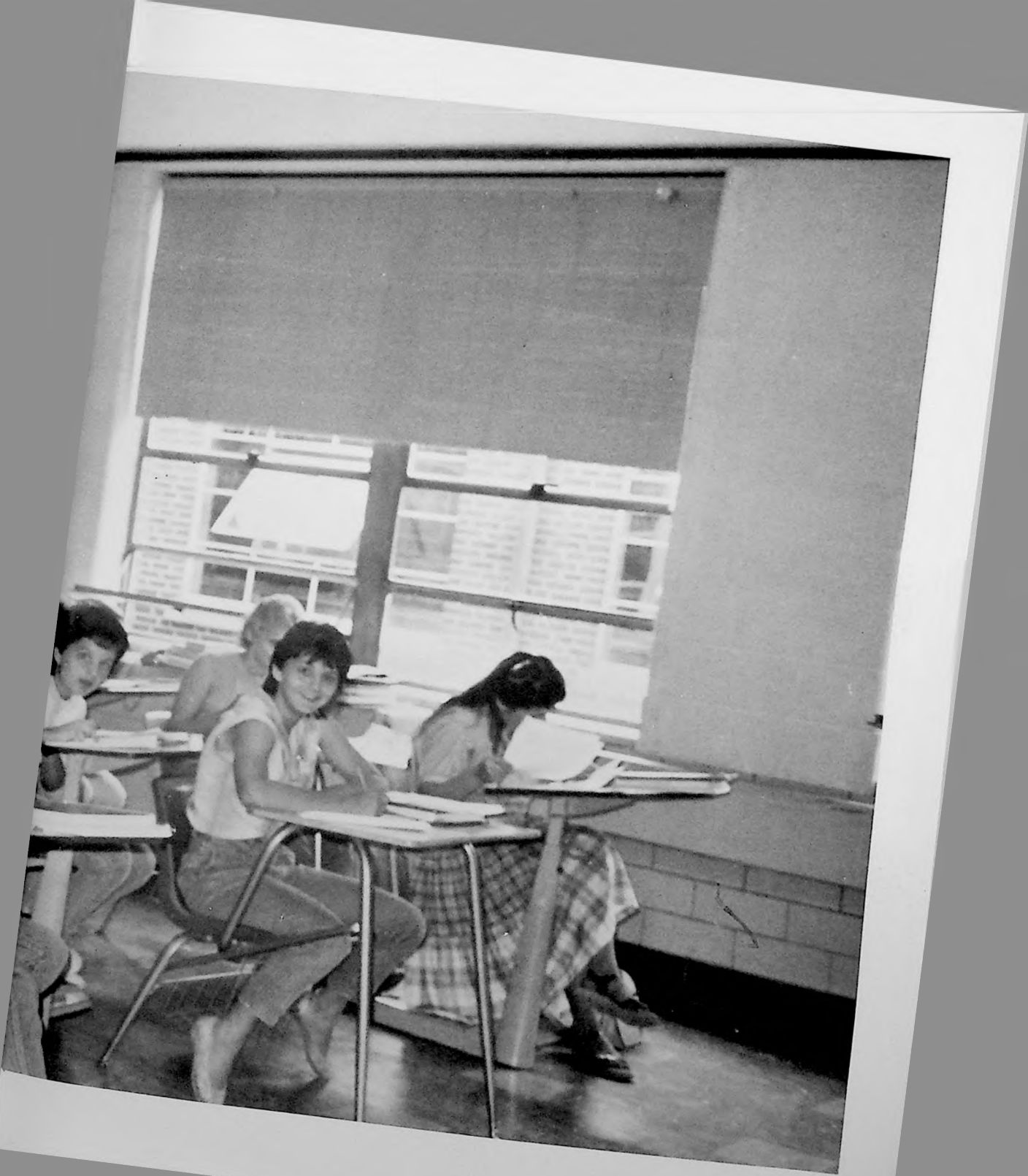

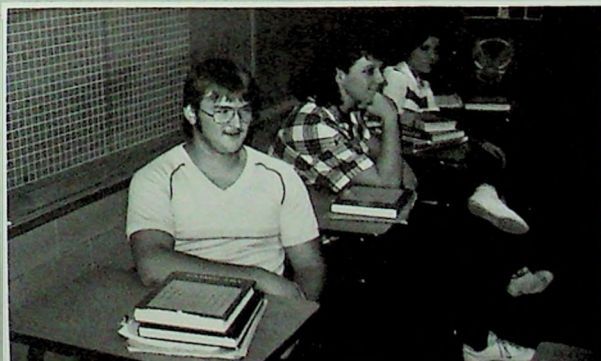

Individually, the Streaks were led by Junior Scott Ritchie who broke the school

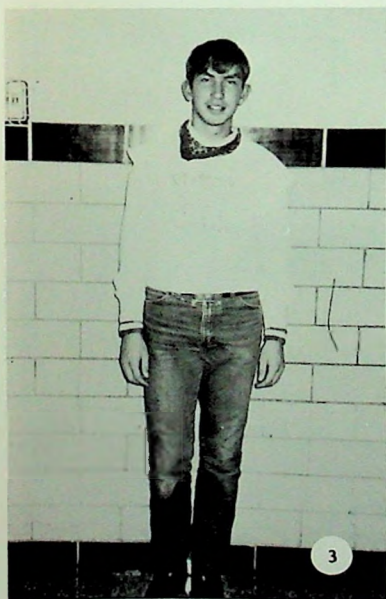

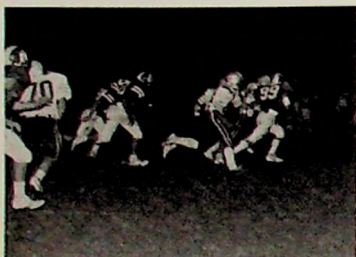

Coach Chester said, "The one thing you can say about our senior players is that they went out as winners on and off the field."



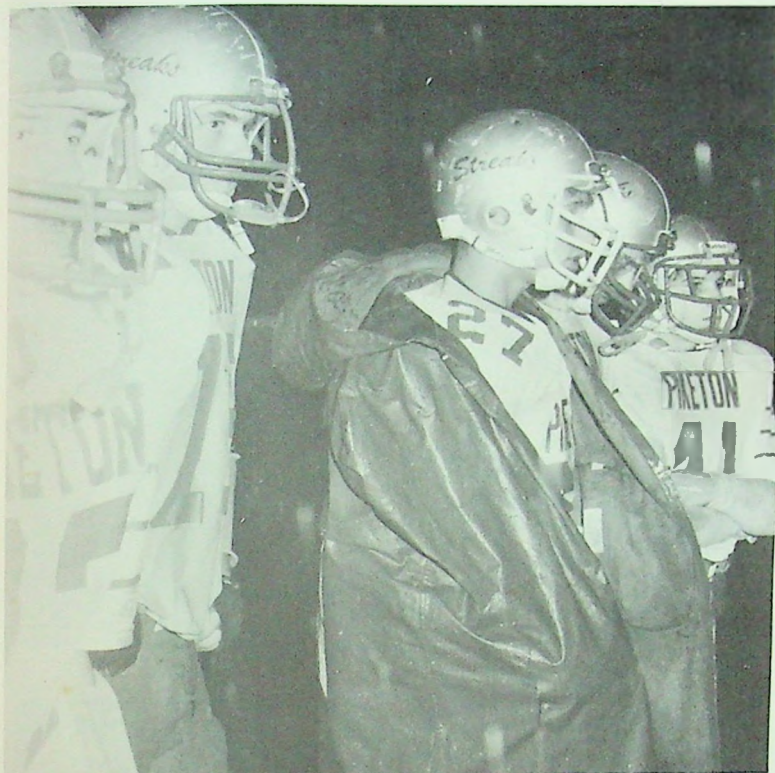

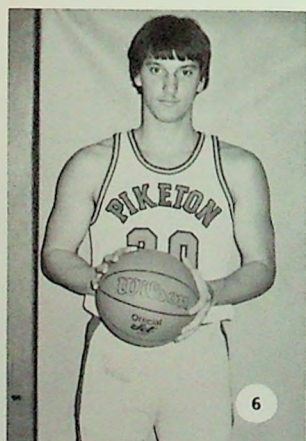
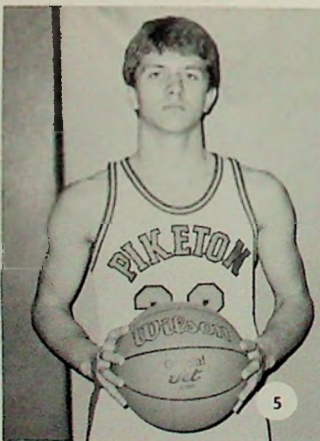

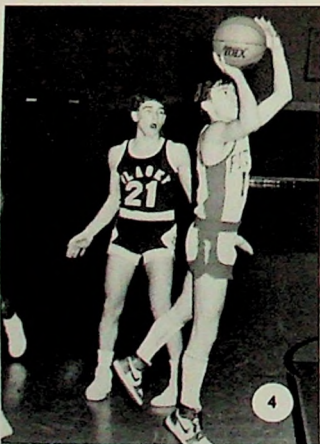

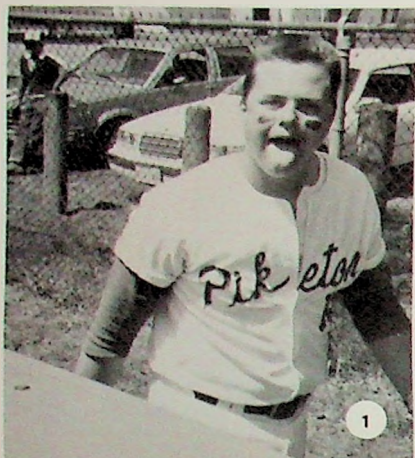

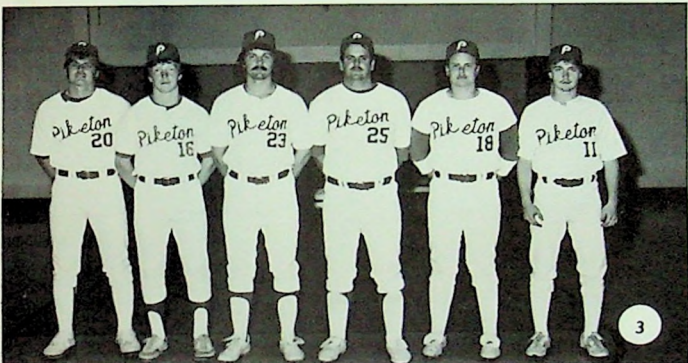

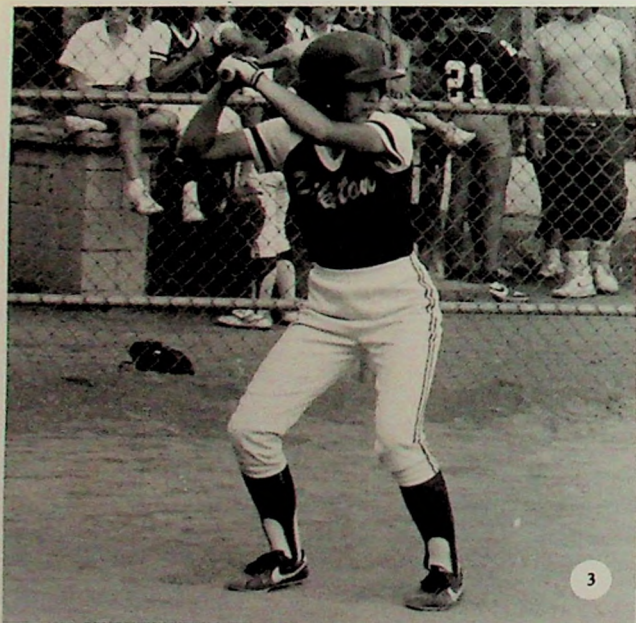
FANTASTIC SEASON

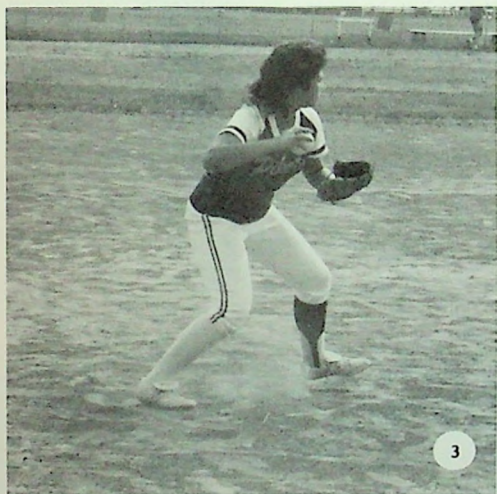
Coach Williams felt the team had a successful season finishing with a 14-6 record.

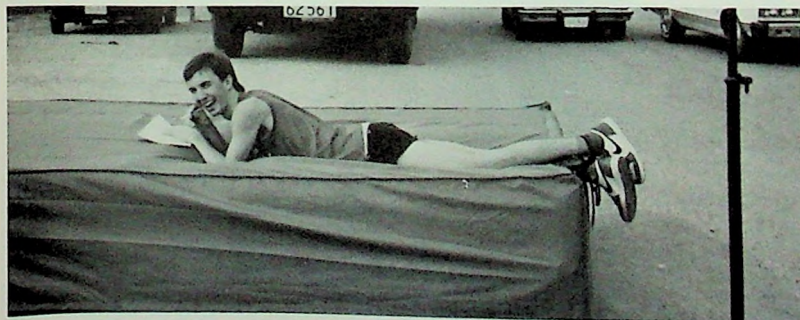

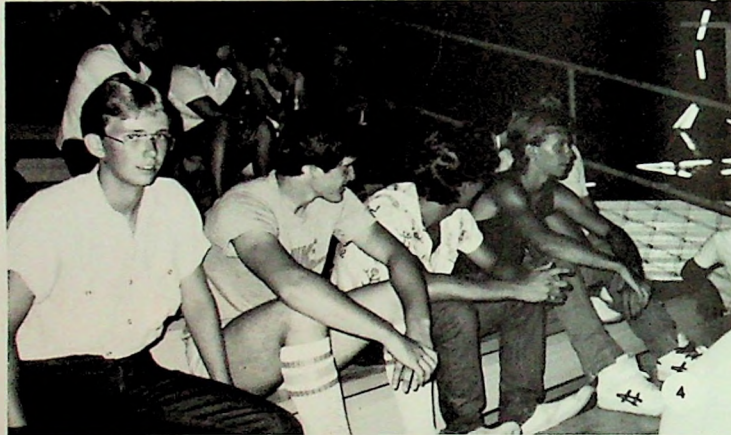

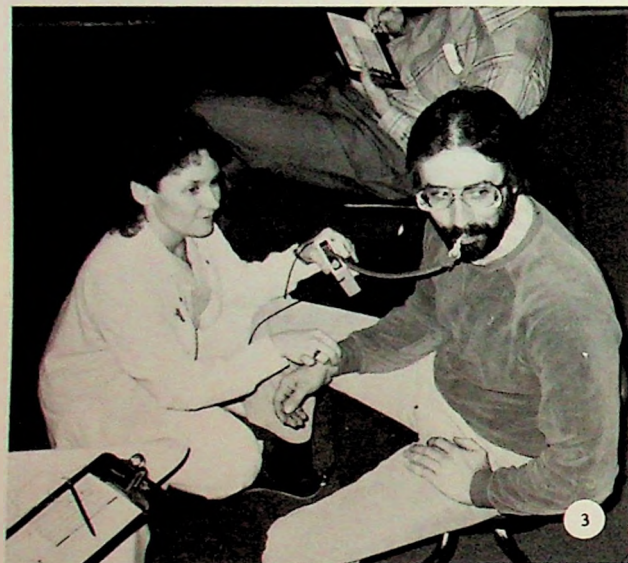

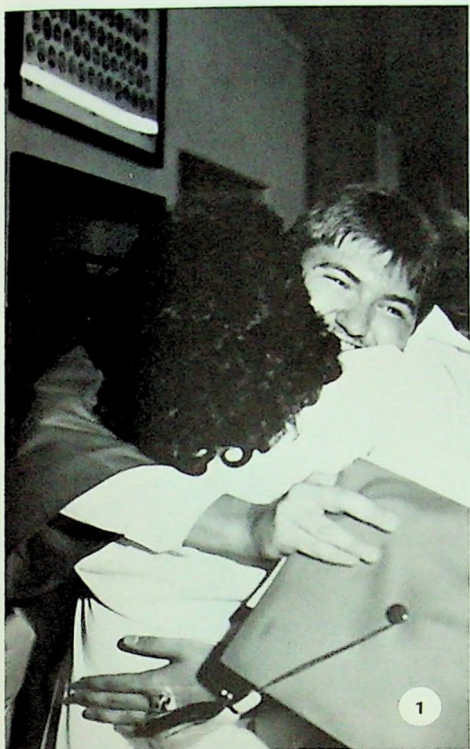

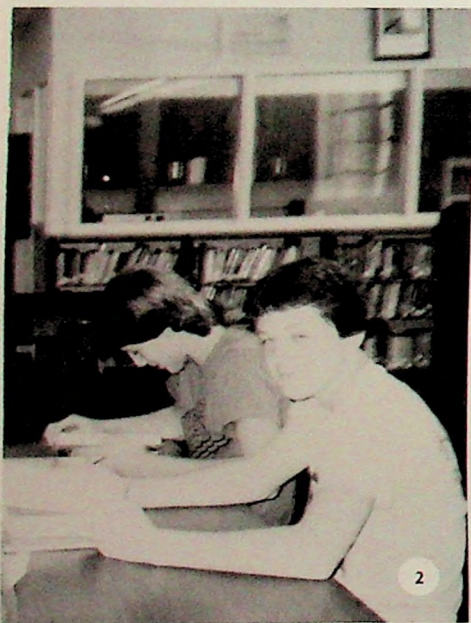

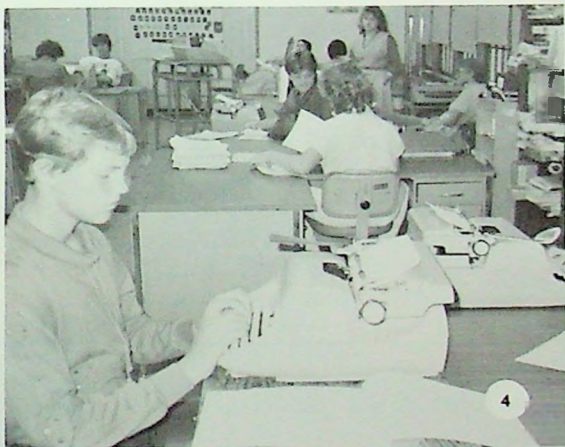
