



MR. BRADY SIMS (1902-1967)


Mr. Sims was born in Glen Falls, West Virginia on October 1, 1902. He was the son of the late William B. and Mary E. Sims. He had a family of seven brothers and sisters. Mr. Sims attended public schools in Harrison Co., and was graduated from Victory High School in Clarksburg in 1921. In high school he was active in football, basketball and baseball. Brady Sims attended West Virginia University and was graduated from Salem College in 1925 with an A.B. Degree. He was active in sports; being a three-letter man.

Mr. Sims taught at Spencer, West Virginia and Nutter Fort, West Virginia. He also taught and coached athletics in Clarksburg for ten years where he was League Championship Coach in 1932, and at which school he was Principal in the school year of 1933-1934. Before resuming his teaching career, Mr. Sims started working for the Hazel-Atlas Glass Company in Clarksburg. Here he started the personnel department and served twenty-three years as the director of that department.

After some additional courses at Salem College, he returned to teaching in 1962 in the Eastern Local School District. Mr. Sims took an active interest in local activities and politics and was a former manager of the Clarksburg City Council. He had been a former Superintendent of Playgrounds for the City of Clarksburg. He taught Sunday School in North View E.U.B. Church for twenty-seven years and later in Central Christian Church in Clarksburg, where he was a member at the time of his death.

He was married to Nora Alonso of Clarksburg, West Virginia, June 17, 1932. Mr. Sims had one son, James Brady Sims, born in 1935 and died in infancy.



The Vocational School was founded in 1957. The school offers four vocational subjects to the curriculum.

Cosmetology training includes all phases of the field of beauty culture: shampoos and rinses, scalp treatments, manicuring, haircutting, and additional related skills. Practice on mannikins and other students begins the practice experience. At the completion of training, students are prepared to take state licensing exams.

Industrial electronics includes the fundamentals of electricity, magnetism, vacuum tubes, semi-conductors, transistors, and complex equipment that is used to provide information about and the control of machines. Radio control systems, automatic control devices, electronic heating devices, and magnetic tape for recording and reproduction are generally included in the course.

Machine trade prepares the student for employment as an apprentice machinist. Related instruction is presented in classroom activities and skills are developed through practical shop experience.

In the related portion of the training, the student studies blueprints, mechanical drawing, shop practices, trade terminology, metallurgy, shop and machine safety, and types and hardening of metals.

Practical shop instruction includes learning of proper speeds and the operation of machine tools.










COACH'S MESSAGE
