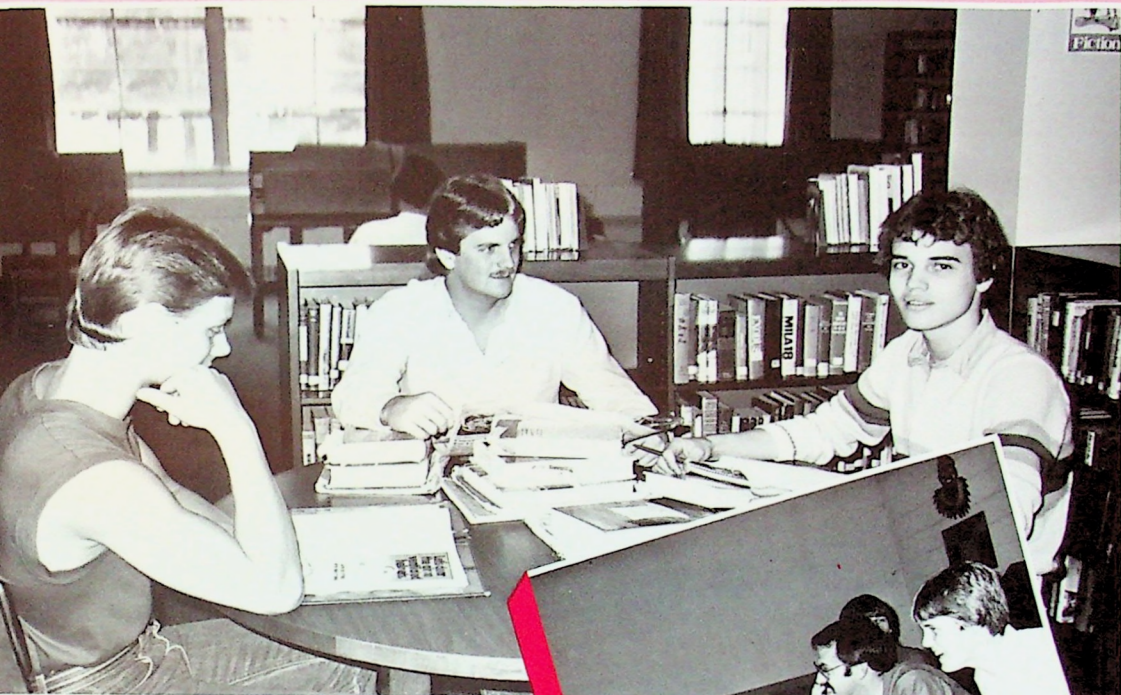
A Flash Of Energy

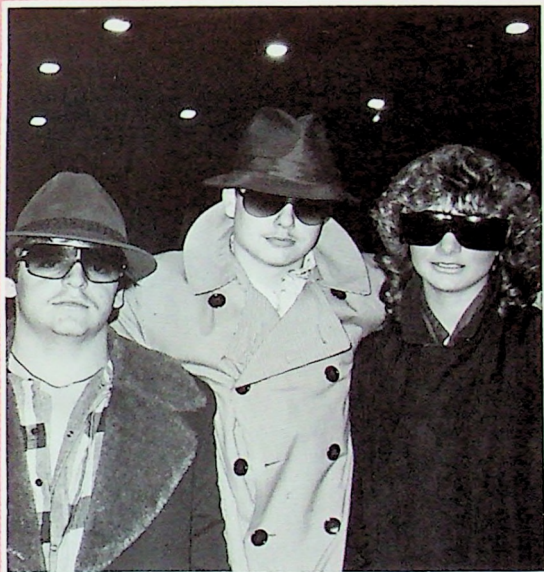

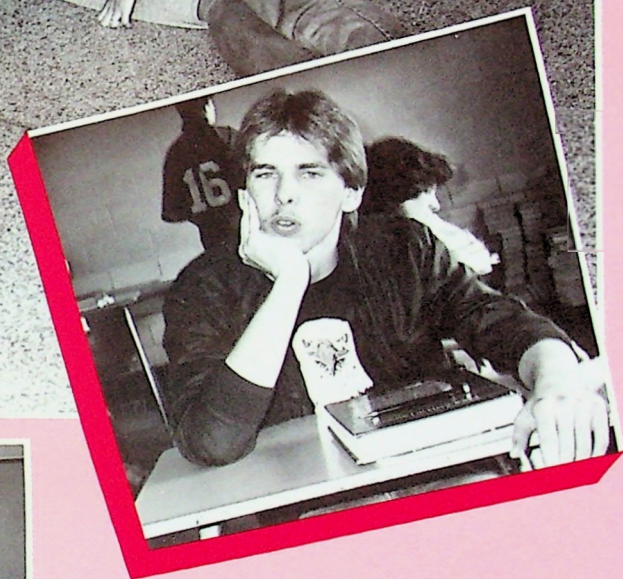
Hanging Out With Friends

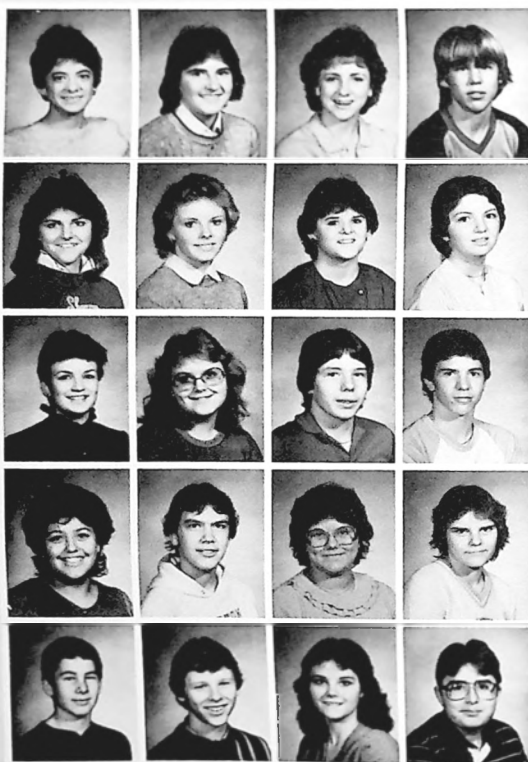

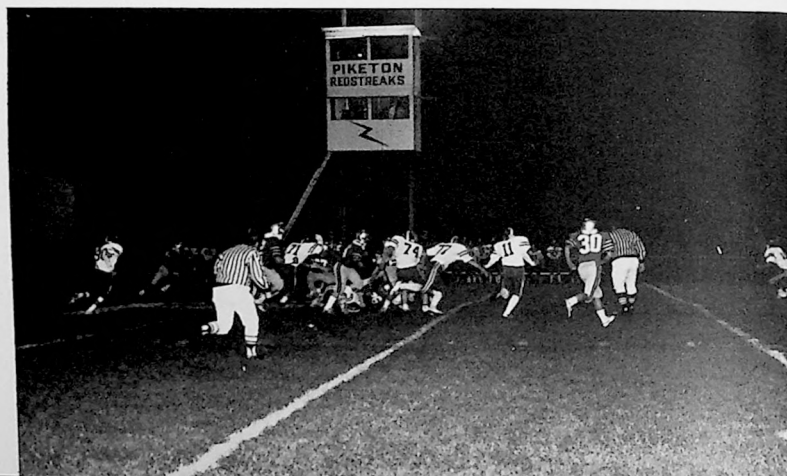
WE NEVER GAVE IN

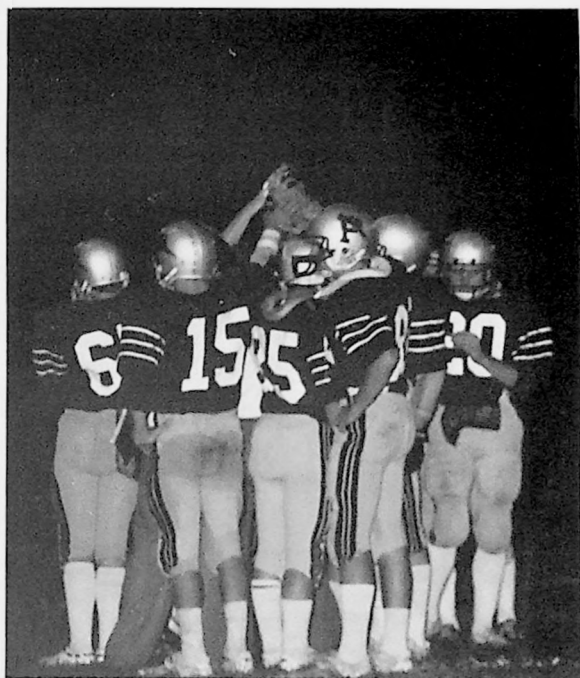

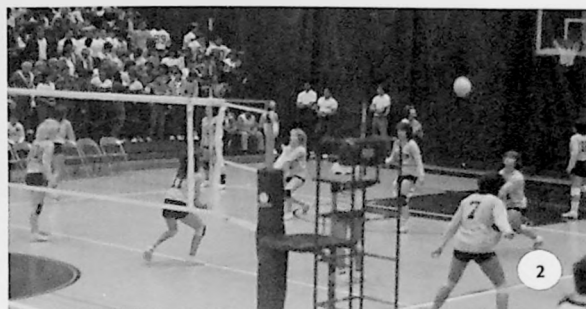
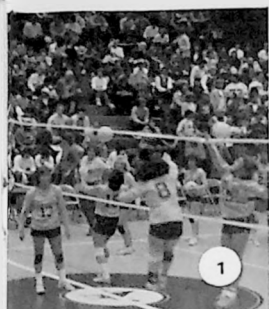

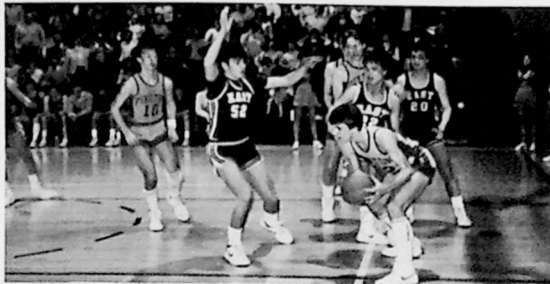

Their record placed them third in the Scioto Valley Conference, a good follow-up to last year's championship team.

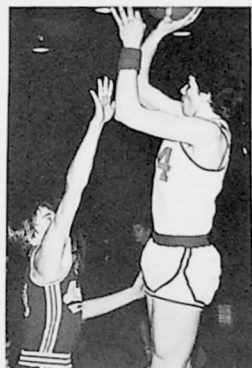

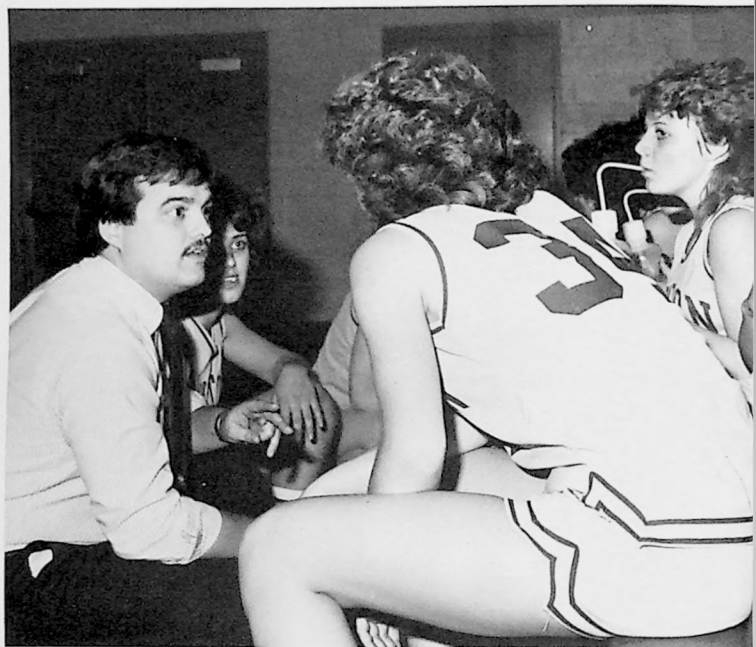

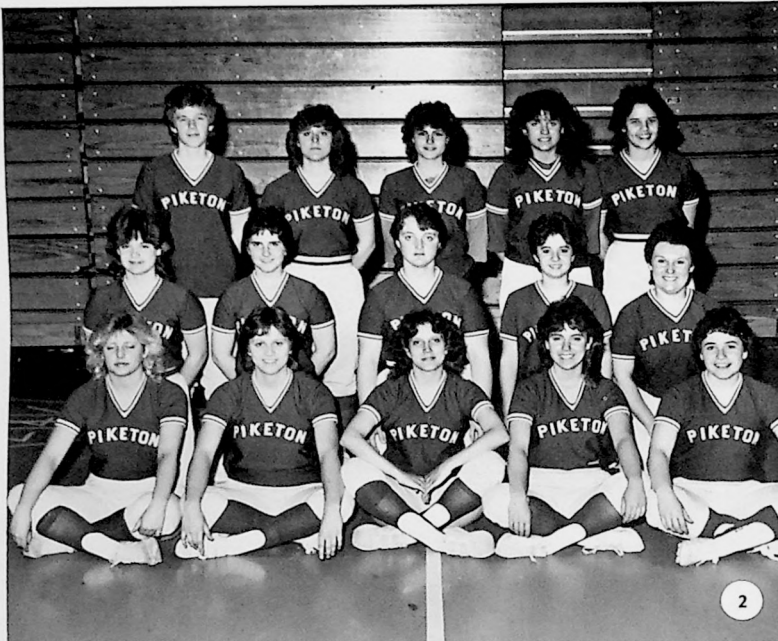

The 1985 edition of the boys track team was supposed to be a disappointment due to the graduation of key performers last year.

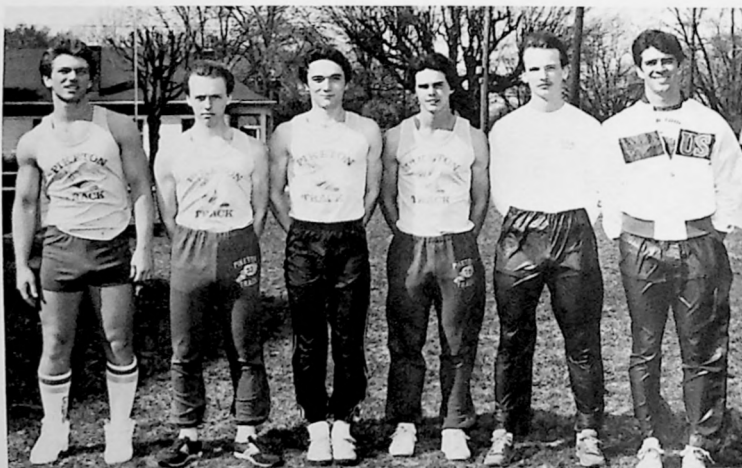
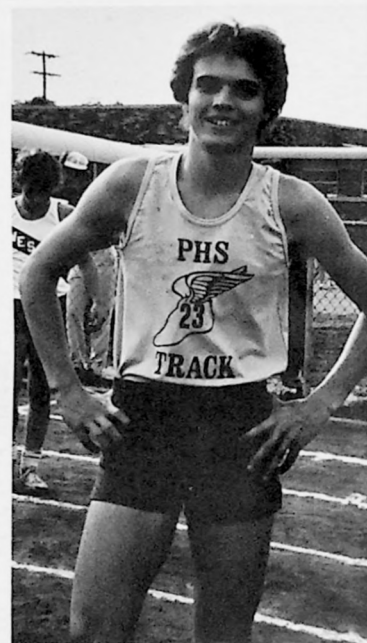
This was not the case however, as the team won their third straight Pike County Meet, pulling out a thrilling 108-105 victory over Waverly.

The students made **Spirit Week** startling by wearing trash bags and other unknown apparel. This week made P.H.S. look fashionable.





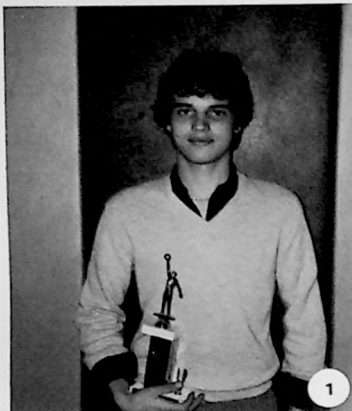

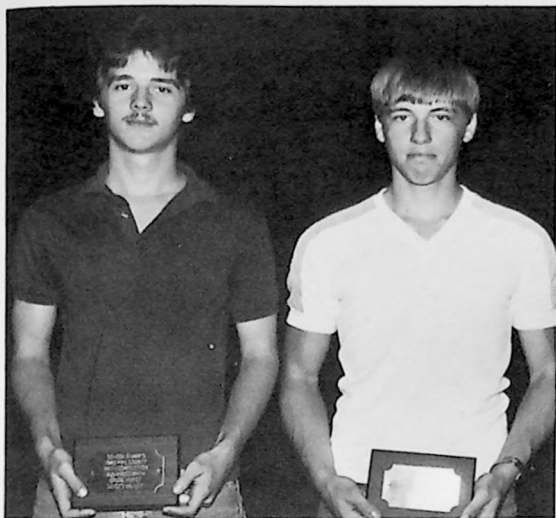
AWARD WINNERS

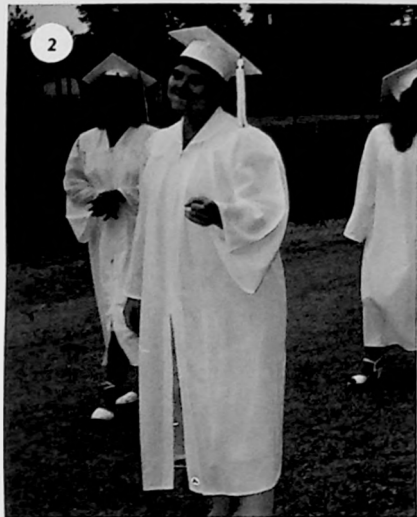

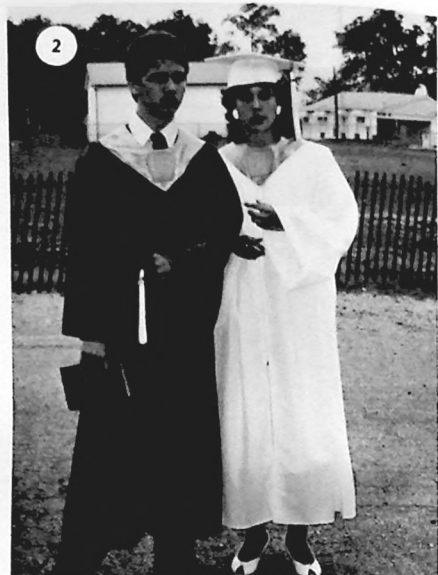

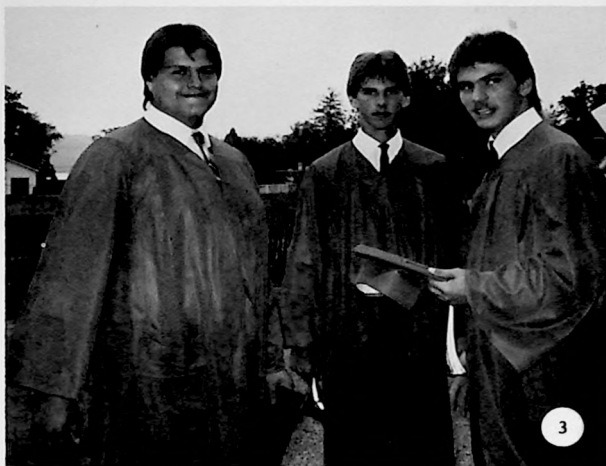

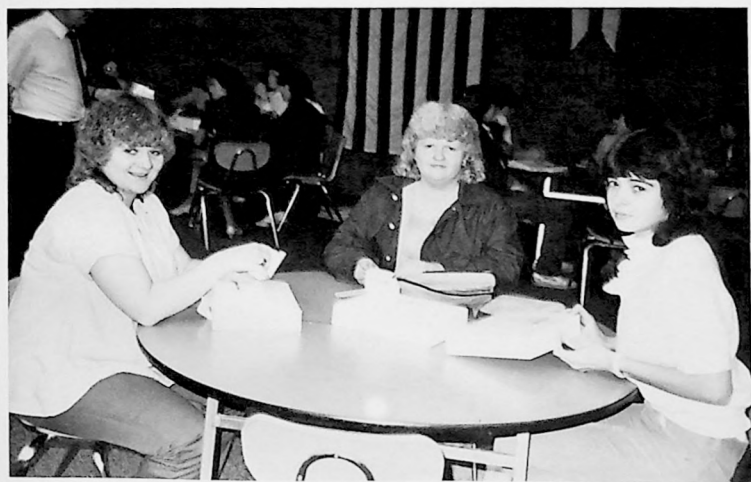

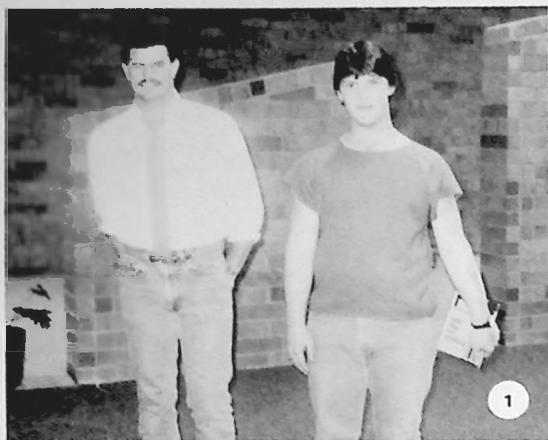

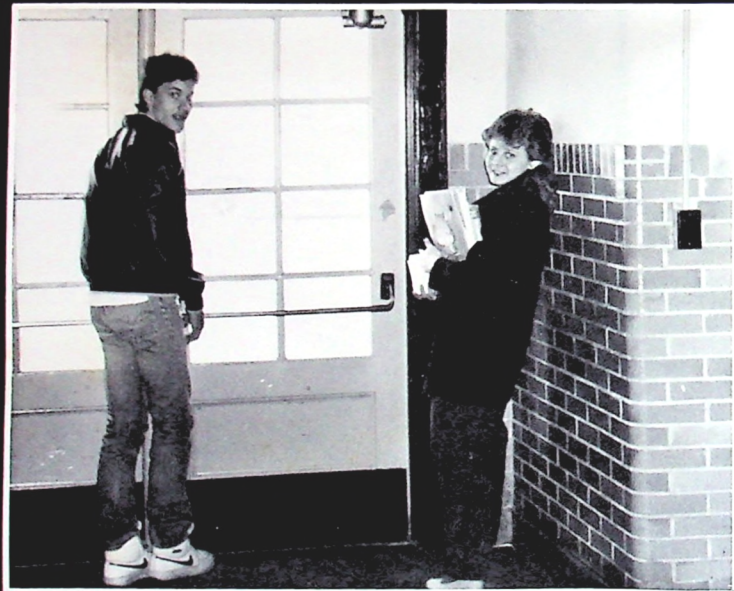
Yearbook Journalism students at Piketon High School planned, designed, and prepared all material for the 1985 **PIKETONIAN** yearbook. Yearbook staff members were instructed as part of the school's elective Journalism program. Students worked on the book during one class hour per day, in addition to frequent after school and Saturday meetings.

The **PIKETONIAN** was printed by Jostens Yearbook Company, Clarksville, Tennessee. The school's plant consultant was Gail Brown. Representing the publisher at Piketon was Rob Rainier. Consisting of 148 pages in a 7 1/2 x 10 1/2 format, The **PIKETONIAN** was printed on 80 pound white glossy enamel stock. A 150 point line screen for halftones was used. Screened backgrounds, when used, resulted from 10, 30, 60 percent screenings of 100 percent black. The cover consists of 150 point binders board with a white styleline base material onto which the artwork was reproduced in four color lithography.

Cover artwork was designed by Jostens Creative Services Art Department.

For the theme section, division pages, and closing pages, Mistral headline type style in 36 and 42 point was used. The remainder of the book was done in 10 point body copy and 8 point caption copy with emphasis face in bold.

Four color ovals reversed out of black backgrounds were used in the Senior color section. Spot color Tempo 185 was used in the theme section as headlines, tool lines, and backgrounds ranging from 30 percent to 100 percent.
