

Hanging Out With Friends








REDSTREAKS SPARK WITH EXCITEMENT





























A Spark For The Future






























STREAKS STRIKE THE SVC AGAIN





Students worked on the book during one class hour per day, in addition to frequent after school and Saturday meetings.

The PIKETONIAN was printed by Justens Yearbusk Company, Clarkaville, Tennessee. The school's plant consultant was Gail Brown. Representing the publisher at Piketon was Roh Rainier. Consisting of 148 pages in a 7½ x 10½ format, The PIKETONIAN was printed on 80 pound white glossy enamel stock. A 150 point line screen for halftones was used. Screened backgrounds, when used, resulted from 10, 30, 60 percent screenings of 100 percent black. The cover consists of 150 point hinders board with a white styleline base material onto which the artwork was reproduced in four color lithography.

Cover artwork was designed by Jostens Creative Services Art Department.

For the theme section, division pages, and closing pages, Mistral headline type style in 36 and 42 point was used. The remainder of the book was done in 10 point body copy and 8 point caption copy with emphasis face in hold.


Four color ovals reversed out of black backgrounds were used in the Senior color section. Spot color Tempo 185 was used in the theme section as headlines, tool lines, and backgrounds ranging from 30 percent to
