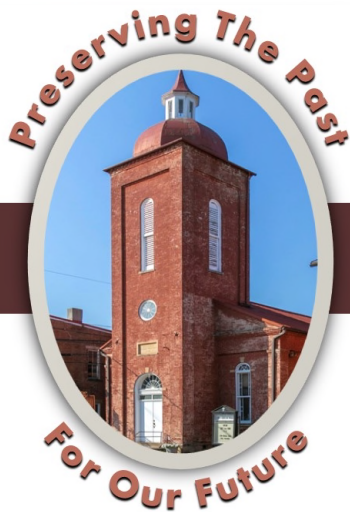

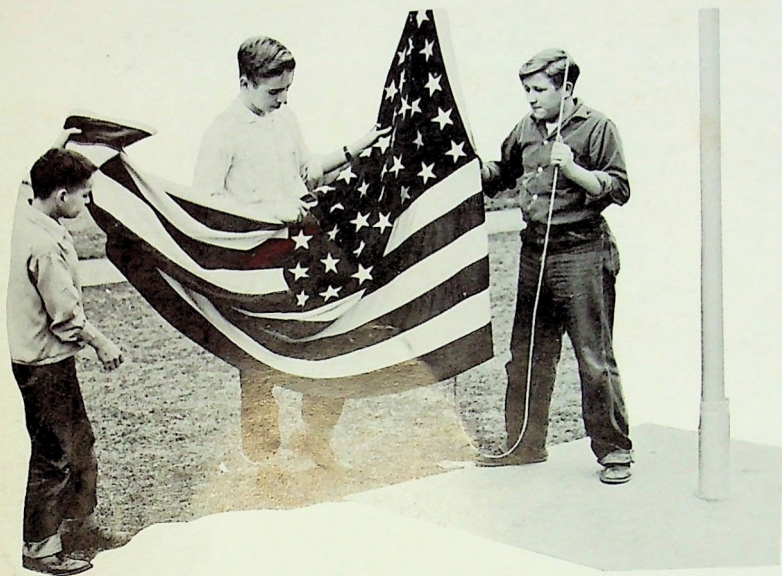

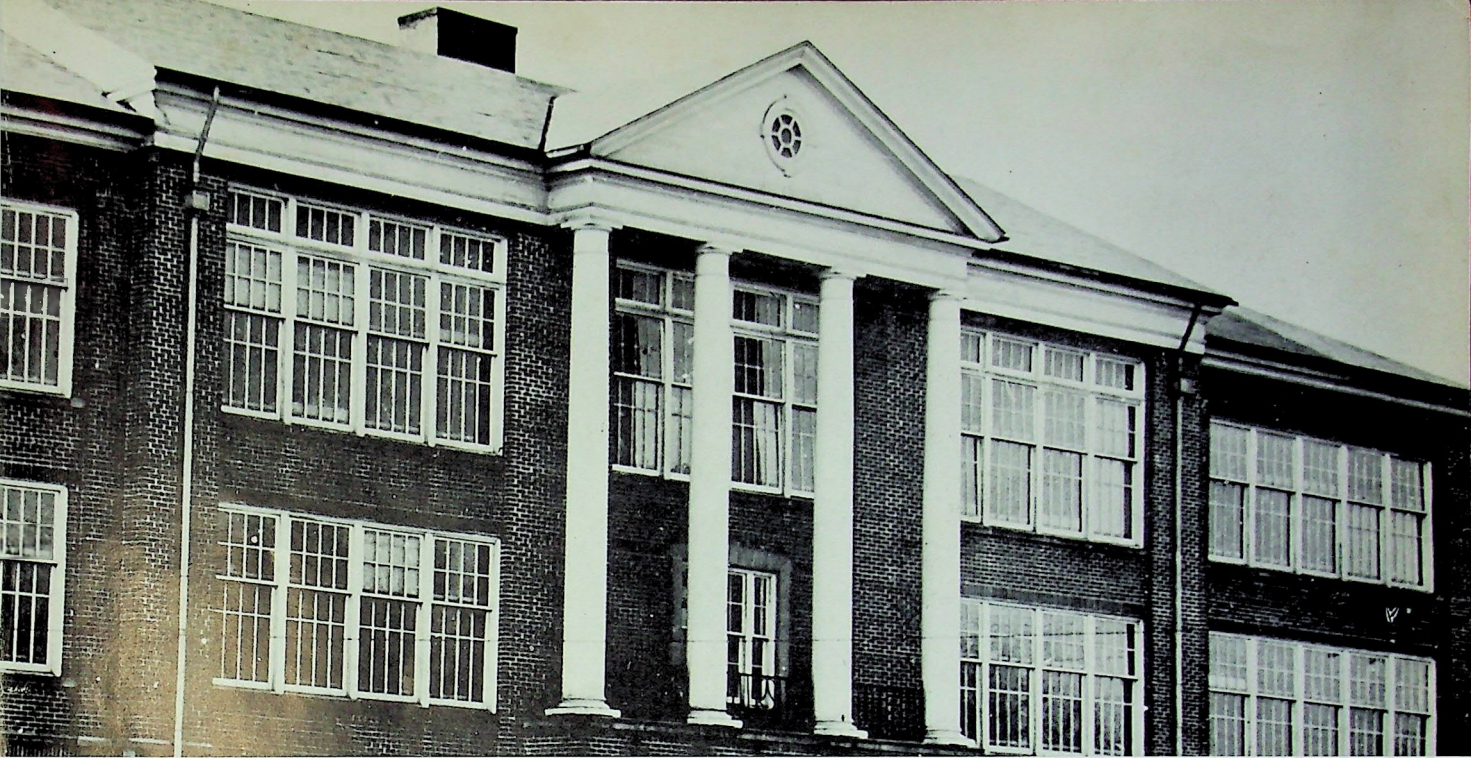

County Superintendent Of Schools

Mr. Way is a native of Pike County where he received his early education and later became a teacher. He received degrees from Ohio Northern University and the University of Wisconsin.

After a few years of successful teaching and superintendency elsewhere he returned to Waverly in the fall of 1926 to become supervisor of the Waverly Schools. In 1931 he became Superintendent of Schools of Pike County.

He is recognized and credited for his progressive school program by the people of our own community, and he is regarded as one of the educational leaders throughout the state.

Board Of Education Contributes Valuable Leadership

The Piketon Local Board of Education is providing excellent facilities for the students of the Piketon school district under the leadership of the President, Reverend Donovan Humble.

The coming of the atomic energy plant made necessary a wide variety of activities in order to care for the increased enrollment.

A new eleven room temporary building was constructed by the United States government on a site provided by the Board, and a new fourteen room permanent building is now being used to care for the present and possible increased enrollments in the elementary school.

The huge remodeling program of the high school building, now in progress, will adequately meet the needs of the community and provide for future growth.

These improvements have been made with a minimum of cost to the local citizens. At the same time, the best interests of the boys and girls of our community have been the focal point of the Board at all times.

A variety of occupational interests have added to the wisdom of the planning and legislative thinking that have helped to administer successfully their great responsibilities.

Reverend Donovan Humble represents the ministry; William Holt represents the farmer, and John T. Rittenour reflects the legal approach. Nelson Pettit is listed as a plumber, and Merle Nelson is a filling station operator.

A deep realization of their heavy responsibilities and a co-operative approach to their many problems have been major factors contributing to the successful solutions of their many problems.

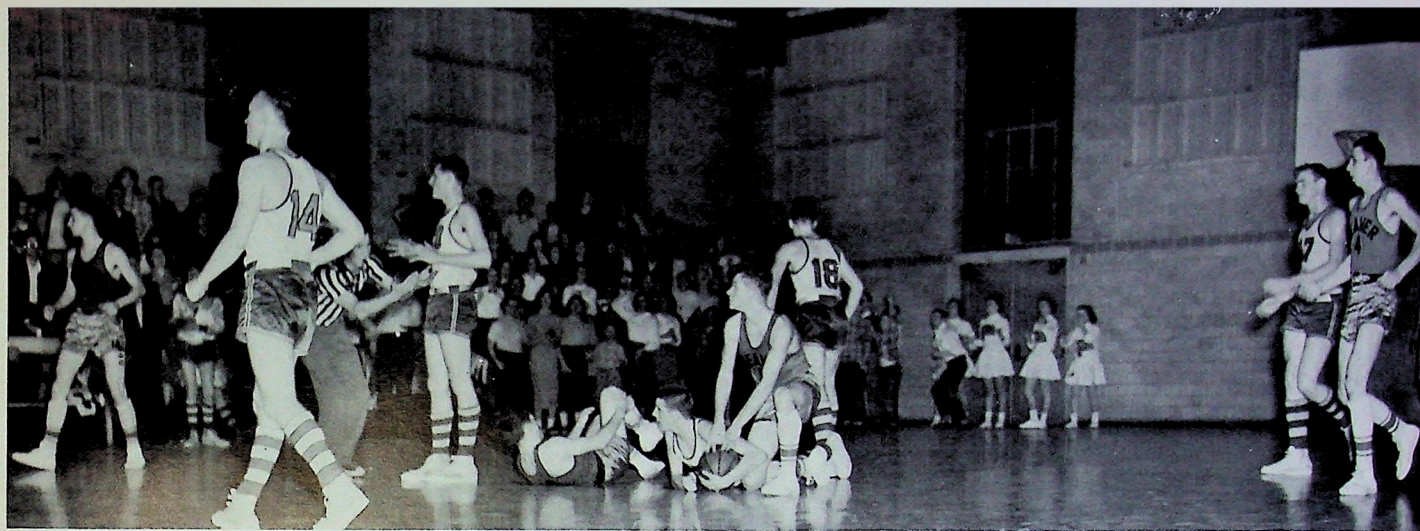
