

BY virtue of an order to us directed by John Fuller, a Justice of the Peace of Strongsville township, in Cuyahoga County, we have received and appraised two stray Mares and one Colt, taken up by Zebulon W. Field, of said township, and find one to be a bright bay, fifteen hapsds high, dark mane and tail, has a ringbone on the right hind foot, a scar on the same thigh, a small bunch on the left side, is lame in the fore feet, no artificial marks, supposed to be six years old, and we do appraise said Mare at forty five dollars. The other, a chesnut color, dark mane and tail, fifteen and a half hands high, no artificial marks, supposed to be three years old, and we do appraise said Mare at fifty dollars. The Colt, a light bay, fourteen hands high, dark mane and tail, right hind foot white, a strip of white in the forehead, supposed to be about two years old, a gelding, no artificial marks, and we do appraise said Colt at thirty dollars.
