GENERAL QUESTIONS:

 Question: Where should an employment notification for archaeological services be sent or posted?

Answer: Suggest you contact the Society for Hawaiian Archaeology and the State Historic Preservation Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources.

2. Question: Where can I find more materials about Kaho'olawe in general?

Answer: The State of Hawaii archives, State of Hawaii libraries and the University of Hawaii Library.

3. **Question**: How many acres were addressed in the Model Cleanup? How many personnel were on the project and how long did it take?

Answer: 240 acres were cleared in the Model Cleanup. Priorities of the Model Cleanup differ from the priorities of this project and comparing one with the other would be misleading as to personnel, cost and time. The delivery order for the Model Cleanup was issued in June of 1995 and ended in January of 1996.

4. Question: When was the last goat removed from the island?

Answer: 1993.

5. Question: Where is the Open Burn/Open Detonation (OB/OD) located?

Answer: The location is identified on Map TR-1 of the Sample Project (Attachment JL.2 of the RFP).

BASE CAMP QUESTIONS:

1. Question: Are there any archaeological sites in the Landing Zone (LZ) area?

Answer: There are archaeological sites in the vicinity of the base camp, including the LZ. These sites are indicated on the map provided in the Request for Proposal (RFP) and in the reference documents cited in the RFP. Answer: Approximately 10 people.

8. Question: Which equipment is owned by Worldwide Services, Inc. (WSI)?

Answer: WSI owns the humvees and leases the orange skytrack forklift.

Question: Which equipment is Government-Furnished Equipment (GFE)?

Answer: Refer to Section J, Attachment JC-10, of the RFP.

10. Question: When do the mice start to appear in the base camp?

Answer: Late summer.

11. Question: Are there any communication cables that run from the LZ to the base

Answer: They work in various areas of the island. Those areas not in the

direct line of sight of Maui may be unreliable.

13. **Question**: Are Contractors allowed to tear the buildings down?

Answer: If proposed, it will be considered by the Government and will be discussed with the Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission (KIRC).

14. Question: Was a flow test performed on the leach field for the Reverse Osmosis (RO) unit?

Answer: No. A flow test was not performed, however a percolation test was performed during the Model Cleanup.

15. Question: What is the completion date of the WSI Contract?

Answer: The current contract ends on 30 September 1997.

16. **Question**: How does the communication cable run from the old demolition range tower off of Rocky Road?

Answer: It starts from the old demolition tower which is west of the base camp, at grade, is buried as it crosses Rocky Road, then runs up the telephone pole at the CM Shop (Bldg. 30), and runs overhead to the buildings.

17. Question: Is three-phased power used?

Answer: Yes.

18. Question: Have the water tanks near the shower trailer ever been used?

Answer: The white and gray water tanks are currently in use. The black water tank, installed during the Model Cleanup, has never been used.

19. **Question**: Was the area under the water at Honokanai'a beach cleared?

Answer: No. The area under the water at the Honokanai'a beach landing from the ocean to the high water line has not been cleared of UXO.

20. Question: Was soil brought to elevate the LZ at the base camp?

Answer: We do not believe soil was brought in, however, there is no documentation to support this.

LUA MAKIKA QUESTIONS:

 Question: When was the last time the K1 Road was graded near the Seeder Shed?

Answer: We are uncertain, however, we believe that the road was last extensively graded in 1985-1986. We also believe that part of the K1 Road near the base camp was last worked on in 1992-1993.

2. Question: How far is Lua Makika from the base camp? How long does it take to drive that distance?

Answer: It is approximately 9.5 miles from the base camp to Lua Makika and takes approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes to drive by jeeps.

3. Question: Is Site 633 included in the Sample Project?

Answer: No, see Amendment No. 0001.

4. Question: How long did the irrigation at the NIFTOL plantings work and when did the Navy stop irrigating?

<u>Answer</u>: The irrigation system failed shortly after installation. Water transportation to the site ceased in early 1994.

Question: Could the will will trees be used for replanting?

<u>Answer</u>: If proposed, it will be considered by the Government and will be discussed with the KIRC.
