AGREEMENT

between

PACIFIC DIVISION, NAVAL FACILITIES ENGINEERING COMMAND

and

SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE UNITED STATES DEPAREMENT OF AGRICULTURE

THE PURPOSE of this agreement is to implement a conservation program for the Island of Kahcolawe. The Soil Conservation Service will assist the Pacific Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command design and install measures as planned for in the Erosicn Control Program for Kahcolawe Island.

THE AUTHORITY for execution of this agreement is Section 601 of the Economy Act (31 U.S.C. 686).

A. THE SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE WILL:

- Provide necessary technical services and/or certain materials to install conservation measures according to the Kahcolawe Erosion Control Program with full cost reimbursement not to exceed \$25,000 annually.
- Bill the Department of the Navy on Form SF-1081, on a quarterly basis, for all actual expenses incurred during the preceding quarterly period.
- B. THE PACIFIC DIVISION, NAVAL FACILITIES ENGINEERING COMMAND WILL:
 - Furnish at their expense certain items to facilitate the work of the Soil Conservation Service. These items will include the following:
 - a. Arrange for field visits to Kahoolawe for SCS personnel. Visits are not to exceed eight days per month and will be on a not-to-interfere basis with military training.
 - b. Transportation to Kahoolawe from Cahu and Maui when requested by the Soil Conservation Service.
 - c. Ground transportation on Kahoolawa.
 - d. Safety Personnel to guide Soil Conservation Service Personnel in avoiding hazardous situations.

APPENDIX B

- e. Furnish information on military training and operations, cultural or archaeological sites, and other significant items on Kahoolawe requiring consideration in the design and installation of conservation measures.
- f. Furnish any surplus materials that are suitable for use in installing conservation measures and that are readily available, as mutually agreed with SCS.
- 2. Reimburse the Soil Conservation Service for actual costs billed in accordance with Clause A-1 and A-2.

C. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

- This agreement will be effective October 1, 1979 September 30, 1980.
- The parties agreed that information obtained under the terms
 of this agreement is public property and will not be used for
 the profit of any individual or organization.
