vs. Affidavit

Bud. Donehi, Defendant.

Affiant, J.F. Van Arsdall, states that he is the Plaintiff in the above styled action, and that the Defendant, Bud. Donehi, is indebted to him in the sum of FIFTEEN DOLLARS, balance due on contract for services rendered in a suit for divorce against Etta Donehi in the Mercer Circuit Court, filed in said court Feb. 26, 1923, and in which judgment was rendered in Defendant, Bud. Donehi's favor May 25, 1923; that said claim is for money due under contract with Defendant; that it is just, and Plaintiff believes he ought to recover of him the sum of \$15.00 and his cost herein expended. He further states that the Defendant has no property in this state subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy Plaintiff's claim, and that the collection thereof will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and a return of no property found. He prays judgment for the sum of FIFTEEN DOLLARS against the Defendant and his cost herein expended. He further prays that the Southern Railway Company (in Ky.) be summoned as garnishee herein and answer as to any sum of money it may be owing the Defendant, or as to any property in its hands belonging to Defendant.
