Plaintiff says the defendant is indebted to him in the sum of \$132.15 for automobile accessories and repairs furnished and delivered and sold to him at his special instance and request under a contract of purchase and sale, and which amount defendant has agreed and promised to pay him but that although the same is past due he has failed and refused to pay the same.

He states that his claim is just; that he should have and recover of the defendant ^{136 43} ~~\$132.15~~ with interest and costs; that the defendant is about to sell, convey, conceal or otherwise dispose of his property with the fraudulent intent to cheat hinder and delay his creditors including this plaintiff.

Wherefore he prays judgment for ^{136 43} ~~\$132.15~~ and interest and costs and a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant and for all general relief.
