

Dear Mrs. Goodpaster:

Reference is made to our previous letter of 28 September 1949 in which you were furnished information concerning the disposition of the remains of your son, the late Technician Fourth Grade Roy E. Goodp In that letter you were informed that, by the terms of our agreement with the British Government, group burials containing the remains of both United States and British personnel, in which the majority of the remains are those of United States servicemen, are turned over to the United States authorities for final burial; in those instances where the remains of British servicemen predominate, the remains of the group are turned over to the British Imperial War Graves Commission for appropriate burial.

We have recently been informed by the Commission that the urn containing the cremated remains of the group which includes the remains of your son will rest permanently in one of the buildings of the British Commonwealth War Cemetery, Yokohema, Japan, under the protection of the British Government. Besides the remains of your son, the urn contains the ashes of 47 other known and 10 unknown Americans. An inscription on the wall behind the urn will record that the urn contains the ashes of 333 sailors, soldiers, and airmen of the British Commonwealth, the United States of America, and the Kingdom of the Metherlands, who died as prisoners of war in Japan; that the names of 282 are inscribed on the walls; and that the identity of their 51 comrades is unknown.

To assist in memorializing the group which contains the remains of Technician Goodpaster, the British Government has sent the inclosed form to this Office for transmittal to you for verification of data pertaining to your son. It will be noted that inasmuch as individual markers will not be provided, replies to questions 15 and 16 on the form are not required.



Your letter in regard to your son, the late Technician Fourth Grade Roy B. Goodpaster, has come to my attention.

I regret that I must inform you that our records disclose that your son's remains, together with those of other members of the Allied Forces with whom he died, were cremated by the Japanese and interred under Japanese supervision in a communal grave at Daiyuji Temple Cemetery, Higashitani-machi, Shoji, Moji City, Japan. These remains have been recovered and reverently placed in a communal urn in the British Commonwealth War Cemetery, Yokohama, Japan.

I sincerely hope that this information clarifies for you the reason that no "Letters of Inquiry" have been mailed for those men.

May I assure you that you will be advised as to the enactment of any future policies which may effect the disposition of your loved one's remains, and do not hesitate to contact us if we can assist you further.

My son, named above, lost his life in a Japanese prison camp and was buried at Moji.

The families of the men in his company, who died in Japan, are receiving forms to complete in order to have the bodies or ashes returned to the United States. We have not received one and upon inquiry have learned that the forms are sent to the widow. Dorothy Sallee Goodpaster, his wife, re-married in May 1947. Her husband is Woodson Snyder, Harrodsburg Ky. As Dorothy often told me that if my son died over there she would never consent to his being brought back home, I am worried and afraid that now, although she has no right to do so, she might complete the forms and have him placed in a cemetary over there.

Please advise how I can be sure that I, his mother, have a voice in the matter. He was my only son and it would be a great comfort to me to have him near.


