Plaintiff, Harrodsburg Implement Co., states that it is a corporation created under the laws of the state of Kentucky, authorized and empowered to do a general merchandise business in all kinds of farming implements and machinery and having power to sue and be sued in its corporate name.

It states that the defendant, Elmer Harlow, on January 1, 1920, executed and delivered to plaintiffs his certain promissory note which is filed herewith and made part hereof whereby he promised and agreed to pay to plaintiff on the 1st day of July, 1920, the sum of \$52.50 for a steel wheel wagon and a house built on same; that by the terms of the said agreement plaintiffs have a lien on said wagon &c to secure the payment of said note and its interest; that on October 1, 1921, there was and still is due on said note the sum of \$49.75 no part of which has ever been paid.

Plaintiff prays for judgement on said note for \$49.75 with interest thereon from October 1, 1921, and for the enforcement of said lien.
