The plaintiff, Robert L. Black, states that the defendant Silas Divine is indebted to him in the sum of \$10.00 for goods and merchandise sold and delivered by this plaintiff to the defendant and for which he agrees

The plaintiff states that this is an action for the payment of money

and upon contract and that the defendant has no property in this state subject to execution and not enough thereon to satisfy the plaintiff's demand and the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay

in obtaining judgment on a return of no property found. Therefore the plaintiff prays for judgment against the defendant in the sum of \$10.00 for his costs for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant and all proper relief.
