Silas Divine,


Defendant-



He states that said defendant purchased the said goods at the times set out in the account which is filed herewith as a part hereof marked "D. for identity.

The plaintiff states that this is an action for the payment of money due upon contract and that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution and not enough therof to satisfy the plaintiff's demand and the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgement or a return of no property found. B

Wherefore the plaintiff prays for judgement against the defendant in the sum of \$10.06 for his costs for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant and all proper relief.
