It appearing that the Defendants, J I Pinkston and L E Wells have both been duly summoned herein, and neither having made any defense to this action, it is adjudged that the allegations in Plaintiff's petition be taken for confessed. It is therefore adjudged that the Plaintiff, First National Bank of Harrodsburg, Ky., recover of the Defendants J I Pinkston and L E Wells, \$108.82 with interest thereon from Sept 8th 1919, subject to a credit of \$50. paid Jany 20th 1920, and that it recover of the defendants its cost herein expended.

It is further adjudged that the plaintiff has a first and prior lien upon 15 head of sheep now in the possession of the defendant J I Pinkston on his farm in Mercer County, Ky, for the payment of the judgment herein rendered, and it is adjudged that said sheep be sold to satisfy the judgment and cost of this action, including the cost of the sale of said sheep.

Clell Coleman Sheriff of Mercer County is made this Court's Commissioner to make said sale and he is awarded a writ of possession of said sheep to be issued upon his demand. He will make said sale before the Court House door in Harrodsburg, Ky, on the first day of some county or Circuit Court to be held for Mercer County, on a credit of 3 months, and he will advertise the time, terms and place of sale, by written or printed notices posted up; one at the Court House door and three others in conspicuous places in the vicinity of the residence of the said Pinkston. He will ~~take~~ sell so many of said sheep as are necessary to pay
