

MERCER QUARTERLY COURT

First National Bank, *of Harrodsburg Ky* Plff

-vs- Petition in Equity

J I Pinkston and L E Wells,

Deft

of Harrodsburg Ky.
The Plaintiff, First National Bank, states that it

is a corporation duly organized under the laws of the United States and doing business as a National Bank, with its principal place of business at Harrodsburg, Ky.

It says that on the 11th day of April 1919, the Defendant, J I Pinkston, by his promissory note, which he executed and delivered to the Deft, L E Wells, agreed and promised, six months thereafter to pay to the said Wells, \$285.; that the said Wells for value received assigned and transferred the said note to this Plff by his written indorsement thereon. It says that on the ~~11th day of~~ April 1919 the Deft Pinkston received credit on said note of \$9.50 leaving due thereon the sum of \$275.50, and on Sept 8th 1919, he paid the further sum of \$175., leaving due the Plaintiff the sum of \$108.82 with interest thereon from Sept 8th 1919, and that except said payment, no part of said debt has ever been paid.

It says that to secure the payment of the said note, the Deft retained a lien on 15 head of sheep and the increase thereof and the wool produced from the same, and that the said J I Pinkston is now the owner and in the possession of the said sheep, and that this plaintiff has a first and prior lien thereon for the payment of \$108.82 and interest and the cost of this action.

Said note is filed herewith.

Wherefore it prays judgment against the Defendant for said sum of \$108.82 with interest thereon from Sept 8th 1919, and for a sale of the said 15 sheep to satisfy said debt, interest and cost. It prays for all general and equitable relief.
