The affiant, Oscar Sanders states that he believes and has reasonable grounds for believing that there is now in, on and about the premises in Mercer County Kentucky on the West side of the Frankfort, Harrodsburg & Crab Orchard turnpike, at the junction with the Vanarsdel turnpike, consisting of a residence, outbuildings, small farm and barn, known as the W. A. Sharp property, intoxicating liquor, consisting of moonshine whiskey, the said premises being now in the possession of Walter Litsey.

The affiant says that the basis of his belief and the facts on which it is based is that on July 21, 1930, at about 4.30 p.m. on the aforesaid turnpike about eight miles from said residence that this affiant and the Sheriff of Mercer County arrested said Walter Litsey traveling in an automobile, and with others in a drunken condition; that he had with him in said automobile three quarts of moonshine liquor.

The affiant further says that on July 21, 1930 at 4.45 p.m. he was told by one J. B. RoBards that he the said RoBards had seen the said Litsey in Mercer County Kentucky on July 21, 1930 before noon on the Jackson turnpike with his said automobile backed up against the back of another automobile and said Litsey present, apparently in the act transferring something from one car to the other.

The affiant says that said Litsey has the reputation of being engaged in the illegal handling of intoxicating liquors.
