The Plaintiff states that on May 24, 1921 the defendant executed and delivered to him his promisory note by the terms of which he agreed and promised to pay him one day thereafter the sum of \$108.50 with interest from date until paid; said note is long past due and no part thereof has ever been paid; it is filed herewith as a part hereof; that this is an action for money due on a contract; that he believes the amount of said note is just and due and that he should recover that amount; that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution and not enough thereof to make and pay the amount of said note interest and costs; that the collection thereof will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

Wherefore he prays judgment against the defendant for \$108.50 with 6% interest from May 24, 1921 and costs, and for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant and for all proper relief.
