Plaintiff, James H. Robertson, states that the defendant, Ernest Wickersham, is indebted to him in the sum of \$11.00 on account same being for groceries furnished to defendant at his special instance and request during the months of December 1924 January, February & March 1925 ; that said amount is past due and unpaid.

Plaintiff says that this is an action upon a contract being a contract to pay money for groceries sold to defendant; that said amount is past due and unpaid and is just; that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said indebtedness and the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

Wherefore Plaintiff prays for judgment against defendant in the sum of \$11.00 with interest from April 1st., 1925 ; for costs of this action and for a general order of attachment of defendant's property including a summons against the garnishee , J.T. Jackson Lumber Company , and Plaintiff prays for all other relief to which he may appear to be entitled.
