Plaintiff, J. B. Robards, states that the defendant, Charles Walker is indebted to him in the sum of \$40.00, for professional services rendered; that said account is just, due and unpaid, and though demand has been made upon defendant, he has failed and refused and still fails and refuses to pay said account, or any part of same. Wherefore etc.

Plaintiff says that this is an action upon a contract, being a contract to pay money for professional services, rendered the defendant at his special instance and request; that said account is just; that plaintiff ought to recover the amount of the account, to wit, \$40.00; that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay the demand of this plaintiff; and that the collection of same will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and a return of no property found.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant for the sum of \$40.00, for the cost of this action, for a general order of attachment of the property of defendant, and for all other relief to which he may appear to be entitled.
