The Plaintiff, J.Zinsmeister & Sons, states that it is a corporation, organized under the laws of Kentucky, and authorized to contract and be contracted with and sue and be sued in its corporate name.

It states that the Defendant, M.B.Deane, is indebted to it in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND ONE & 96/100 DOLLARS (\$101.96), balance due for goods and merchandise sold and delivered by Plaintiff to Defendant, at the latter's special instance and request in the years 1921 and 1922, as shown by statement filed herewith as part hereof, marked "J.". No part of said balance has been paid. Plaintiff says that said balance was due January 1, 1923. Plaintiff says that the ~~goods~~ the goods furnished Defendant were of the character and quality contracted for by Defendant and the prices charged therefor were reasonable and just.

Wherefore, Plaintiff prays judgment against the Defendant for the sum of \$101.96 and interest thereon at the rate of 6 per centum per annum from the 1st day of January, 1923, until paid, and its cost herein expended. It prays for all proper relief.
