## COOLING PLANT COMBINED WITH HEATING SYSTEM

Engineers are working to perfect a process whereby the same furnace and radiators which heat a building in the winter can be used to cool it in the summer. This can already be done, but the job of reducing the cost remains. Strange as it seems, steam is used to do the actual cooling. It is sent from nozzles at a speed twice that of rifle bullet. The apparatus is so arranged that the rapidly moving steam creates a vacuum in a chamber. From there the process becomes more familiar. Sudden expansion of water vapor and steam in the vacuum serves to lower its temperature, and it is then not difficult to cool water and circulate it through radiators to cool the building.

## EARLY HATCHED CHICKS PAY BIGGER DIVIDENDS

Some years ago, the poultry scientists of the United States Department of Agriculture made an experiment to compare 100 pullets hatched in March with 100 pullets hatched in June.

A. R. Lee, of the department, says the early-hatched pullets—the pullets hatched in March—began to lay in September and October. The pullets hatched out in June didn't begin to lay until the following February. The pullets from the March hatch laid during October, November, and December, the season when egg prices are highest. Not only that, the early pullets also laid an average of 180 eggs apiece during the year while the late pullets averaged only 110 eggs. That is, the early pullets laid about four dozen more eggs than the late pullets.

At present, the poultry scientists hatch all of their chicks, for egg production, not later than April.

Lee says the early-hatched chicks not only lay early, during the season of high egg prices, and lay more eggs than the late pullets, but they also have two more advantages:

First, the cockerels from the early hatches usually bring good prices because the poultryman can sell them before the big run of chickens reaches the market.

Second, the early chicks grow faster and suffer less loss from parasites and diseases.

## TOTAL VALUES UP ON KENTUCKY LIVESTOCK

Although the number of animals on Kentucky farms the first of this year showed only a slight increase for the year, the value was estimated at \$29,975,000 more.

H. F. Bryant, statistician in charge of the Department of Agriculture office at Louisville, said this was due largely to the increased value of the stock:

The report showed 3,858,000 head, valued at \$104,180,000, compared with 3,177,000 at \$74,205,000 a year ago.

The number of hogs, 1,035,000 was unchanged, but the value jumped from \$6,714,000 to \$9,749,000.

## U. S. ALLOTS KENTUCKY \$48,690 HEALTH FUND

Allocation of \$3,333,000 to States by the Surgeon General to aid in establishing and maintaining adequate public health services was approved this week by the Treasury.

The allocations, intended to cover the remainder of the fiscal year, were made under provisions of the Social Security Act. Determined on the basis of population, special health problems and the States' financial needs, they included Indiana, \$81,196 and Kentucky \$48,690.

## PLANES DROP FOOD FOR MONTANA BIRDS

Forced "on relief" by snows which covered their feeding grounds, deer, and wild fowl in parts of the Rocky Mountains near Denver, were being fed by state fish and game officials and sportsmen's organizations.

Nearly 1,000 pounds of barley, packed in bags which broke readily, have been dropped from an airplane to game birds in western Montana by members of the Great Falls Izaak Walton League.

## NATIONAL FOXHUNTERS RETURN TO KENTUCKY

After holding annual field trials in Maryland, Ohio and Tennessee in the past three years, the National Fox Hunters' Association will return to Kentucky for the big meet next fall, it was decided Friday by directors of the association at Lexington.

## There Are Other Worlds

A man who has made some money without work, and therefore thinks he knows everything, was recently delivering himself on the subject of religion. He dismissed the idea of immortality as mere superstition, the yearning of children afraid of the dark. "Of course, there is no other world," he said.

To which a friend responded quietly: "You yourself have already been a resident of another and very different world. The world in which we now have our existence is a world of alternating periods of sunlight and dark; it is a world where human beings draw air into their lungs and expel it, eat and drink through their mouths, and walk around on their own legs. For nine months you lived inside your mother's body, in a world where there was no light, no air, where no nourishment reached you through your mouth and you were moved about on other legs than your own. Suppose an embryo were endowed with intelligence and imagination. How could it ever form any notion of this outside world? Wouldn't any description of it seem absurd? Wouldn't the embryo say, as you have just said, 'There can be no other world?'"

Just before I left the house this morning I held a conversation with a member of my family in the presence of our dog. As we talked, his little head swung back and forth, his round eyes looking first at one of us and then the other, trying so hard to understand. He dwells in the same house, eats the same food, breathes the same air that we do. But what we say and do and think and hope is utterly beyond his comprehension. He and we are citizens of two different worlds.

I have friends who live in worlds which I never have been able to enter. They see values in pictures my eyes cannot see; music speaks to them in a language I do not understand; they have spiritual experiences which never have come to me. When I am in the presence of the best of them I have no difficulty in believing that there are possibilities of human life far and above our highest imaginings. Even beyond and above the mystery called Death.

## The Show is a Flop

When the tension between England, France and Italy was at its highest point recently, the French veterans sent an appeal to their Premier not to make war on Italy. They said that armed conflict with the soldiers who had been their brave allies was unthinkable.

Now this is a very interesting development in history. In times past the veteran used to sit around the tavern, relating his deeds of courage and urging the young men to prepare themselves for the days when they too would fight.

The veterans of the World War went back to their respective countries with no impulse to boast; memories were graven on their hearts that never can be erased; modest, quiet, tight-lipped, they have kept their war stories to themselves. In almost every country they are now leaders in the cause of honorable peace.

The young people who come to my house tell me that in all colleges and schools the anti-war sentiment is very strong. Does this mean that modern youth is less courageous than its forbears? Not at all. It means that the whole world is coming to realize that war as it used to be and war as it is are two entirely different things. There may have been glory in hand-to-hand conflict; there is no glory in long-distance slaughter.

The age-old road-show called War has lost its following. Today the scenery is worn and tattered and spotted; martial music has lost its magic, the costumes and the well-worn lines of the principals seem to belong to the years of Nellie the Beautiful Cloak Model. The show is a flop.

## MORE STEAKS ON THE WAY, BUT FEWER THAN AVERAGE

More good beef will go to market in the first 4 months of 1936 than in the same months of 1935, if cattle feeders carry out their first-of-the-year plans, says the Bureau of Agriculture Economics.

But cattle in the feed lot at the first of this year in the 11 Corn Belt States numbered 23 to 30 per cent less than the 5-year average, although 41 per cent greater than last year, the largest increase in the 14 years that reports have been made. Last year, the decrease in fattening cattle from January 1, 1935, was the greatest ever recorded.

Feed-lot operations increased about 48 per cent in the western Corn Belt as compared to about 29 per cent in the eastern Corn Belt.
